

- (a) introduce "at any time" double yellow line waiting restrictions:
- (i) at the junction of Elgin Avenue and Oakington Road;
 - (ii) outside Nos. 44 to 50 Oakington Road on both sides of the road;
 - (iii) at the junction of Marylands Road and Harrow Road;
 - (iv) at the junction of Marylands Road and Shirland Road;
 - (v) outside Nos. 94 to 96 Shirland Road on both sides of the road

(b) reduce the length of the existing residents' parking in Oakington Road:

- (i) on the south-western side adjacent to No. 82 Elgin Avenue by approximately 4 metres;
- (ii) on the south-western side opposite Nos. 44 to 50 by approximately 18 metres;
- (iii) on the north-eastern side adjacent to No. 84 Elgin Avenue by approximately 4 metres;
- (iv) on the north-eastern side opposite Nos. 44 to 50 by approximately 20 metres;

(c) reduce the length of the existing residents' parking in Shirland Road (to accommodate a new uncontrolled pedestrian crossing) on the south-western side outside Nos. 94 to 96 by approximately 11.5 metres;

(d) reduce the length of the existing residents' parking in Marylands Road by 1 metre outside Nos. 72 and 97 (closest to the junction with Shirland Road);

(e) introduce one-way working in Marylands Road and Oakington Road (to facilitate the new car park access to the Academy) between the north-eastern kerb-line of Edbrooke Road and a point outside Nos. 44 to 46 Oakington Road;

(f) correct minor anomalies between on-street markings and existing Traffic Orders.
