GREATER LONDON AUTHORITY ACT 1999

### CONGESTION CHARGING

TRANSPORT FOR LONDON hereby gives notice that it has made an Order under Schedule 23 to the Greater London Authority Act 1999 entitled "The Greater London (Central Zone) Congestion Charging (Variation No. 3) Order 2007" ("The Variation Order"). The Variation Order further amends the Greater London (Central Zone) Congestion Charging Order 2004 ("the Scheme Order") made by Transport for London on 30 September 2004 and confirmed with modifications by the Mayor of London on 27 October 2004. The Scheme Order was subsequently varied by further Orders made by Transport for London and confirmed by the Mayor. The Variation Order contains two proposed changes:

- As a result of the introduction of variable penalty levels by London Boroughs on 1 July 2007, which included an increase in the level of penalty for serious contraventions, the variation is required to bring the penalty charges for congestion charging into line with the penalties for serious contraventions imposed such as moving traffic and parking contraventions on the strategic road network, parking offences and obstructions at bus stops, on pedestrian crossings, or in the safety zones outside schools; and

- To reflect the replacement of 'Switch' cards by 'Maestro' cards  
The effects of this change will be as follows:

- 'Switch' references will be replaced by 'Maestro'.

Any representations that are submitted must be made in writing, specify the grounds on which they are made, and be received by Transport for London by 21 September 2007. If approved by the Mayor, these changes could come into effect on 10 December 2007.

#### NOTICE OF SUBSTANTIAL ROAD WORKS
