The notice of the proposal to make it (reference HA 028/002/0160) was published in issue no 58451 of the London Gazette on 18 September 2007 and the effect of the Order is as described in that notice.

The existing Order, The A35 Trunk Road (Chideock) (30 and 40 Miles Per Hour Speed Limits) Order 1997 is revoked by this Order.

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Greenwich Council, hereinafter called the Council, propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would be to:-
- (a) impose waiting restrictions operative at any time on the streets or lengths of streets specified in Schedule 1A to this Notice;
- (b) impose loading restrictions operative at any time on the streets or lengths of streets specified in Schedule 1B to this Notice;
- (c) review the existing and impose new waiting and loading restrictions operative at any time on the streets or lengths of streets specified in Schedule 1C to this Notice

Details of exemptions from the restrictions for certain vehicles and persons, together with restrictions on selling or advertising in a restricted street are contained in the original Order of 2007.

- 3. The general effect of the Greenwich (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) Order would be to provide a disabled persons parking place, on the length of street specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice, in which vehicles displaying a valid disabled persons badge may be left.
- 4. The general effect of the bus stop clearway Order would be to impose 'no stopping except buses' restrictions operative at any time on the lengths of the street specified in Schedule 3 to this Notice.
- 5. The general effect of the free loading places Order would be to provide loading places, on the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 4 to this Notice, operative at any time, where vehicles would be permitted to load and unload for a period not exceeding twenty minutes.
