## Convention for the Evacuation of the Kingdom of Sardinia.

BY virtue of the Full Powers, which we the Ge-nerals commanding the Forces employed in the War in Sicily, as well by Sea as by Land, have re-

War in Sicily, as well by Sea as by Land, have re-teived from our Sovereigns, for treating of a Suf-penfion of Arms, and of the Evacuation of the Kingdom of Sardinia, we have after feveral Confe-rences agreed on the following Articles. I. The fame Sufpenfion of Arms, which has been fettled for the Kingdom of Siely and the Mediter-ranean, fhall fubfit in all its Points for Sardinia. II. The Spanifh Troops fhall evacuate the King-dom of Sardinia, as foon as the German Troops or others which are appointed for taking Poffeffion of it fhall arrive there. All the fortined Places fhall be delivered up, with the Artillery, and Ammuniti-on, found therein when the Spanifh Troops became Mafters of them. III The fick and wounded Men of the Spanific

Ill The fick and wounded Men of the Spanish Troops shall remain in the same Hospitals where they are, with all the Phyficians, Surgeons, and others em-ployed in the Hofpitals for their Cure and Attendance; and it shall be allowed to leave Officers there to take Care of them : The Director of the faid Hospitake Care of them : The Director of the faid Holpi-tals (hall be furnithed with every thing neceffary for fublifting them, on his paying for the fame; and as foon as any (hall be forecovered as to be fit for marching, they (hall be furnithed with Carriages, and Barks with Paffports for transporting them to Spain, at their own Expence; and those of them who may have Arms, (hall be allowed to take them with them. IV. The Officers of the Intendance, Commiffaries of War, Clerks of the Accomptant and of the Trea-furer, as well for Sea as for Land, (hall remain in the Places of the faid Kingdom, as well for adjusting the Accompts as for making the neceffary Dispositions

the Accompts as for making the neceflary Dilpolitions for imbarking the Troops, till it be performed; and a Lift shall be given of the Names of those who are

V. The Civil Officers of Sardinia and others without Exception, the Officers of the Spanish Troops, and any others what foever employed in the Service with the faid Troops, shall be allowed to withdraw out of the faid Kingdom their Families, Effects, and Equipages, to transport them to Spain; the neceffary Pafiports, Carriages, and Barks they shall demand, to

be furnified to them at their own Coft. VI. All the Magazines of Warlike Stores and Pro-visions, and of all things elfe of what kind foever, therein including the Barley and Straw belonging to the Spanish Troops in the Towns and other Parts, healt compare for a and the fait Troops of the last fhall remain fafe; and the faid Troops fhall be al-lowed to fhip them off, or to make Ufe of them as they shall think fit, and Commillaries shall be nomi-nated to take Care thereof, by placing a Guard of German Troops or others, who shall take into their Possession the faid Magazines for their Security.

Polletinon the taid Magazines for their security. VII. The Evacuation of Algeri and of Caftel-Ara-gonefe fhall be performed at the Time agreed, provi-ded the neceffary Imbarkations be ready at Algeri for receiving the Troops, and that they have on board Provitions fufficient for 40 Days. The Gar-rifon of Caftel-Aragonefe fhall be imbarked in the Taion of Caltel-Aragonete infli be imparted in the like Manner; nor ihall thole two Garrifons be obli-ged to march by Land to Cagliari to imbark there: And that of Cagliari fhall imbark at Cagliari; the Cavalry at either of thole Places as the Captain-General who commands in that Kingdom fhall agree, together with all the Artillery, Magazines, Ammu-nition, and Provisions, which may be found in the taid Places belonging to the Spanish Troops; and

those Places shall be delivered up to the German Troops, or others who in their Name shall take Posfeffion of them without meddling with the Fortifica-tions, the fame Day the Spanish Troops shall imbark

to país into Spain. VIII. All the Spanish Troops, Infantry, Cavalry, and Dragoons, shall be transported to Spain, with their Aims, Colours, Standards, Horses, Cloaths, and Baggage, in all Stiety, and without any Obstruction, to be landed on the Coast of Catalonia or Valencia, as well by the Imbarkations with which they may be immediately furnified, as by those which may come from Spain, or by others belonging to other Powers; which Transportation shall be by the shorteft Palfage.

1X. All the Marine and Land Forces in the Condition they now are in the Kingdom of Sardinia, under the Generals, Officers, and other Perfons, who may be employed in the Service of the Spania Forces, thall be permitted to inbark to pais over to Spain a and those Natives of the Country of Sardinia, who would likewise pais over to Spain, shall be allowed to do it without any Hindrance.

X. All the Shipping and Imbarkations neteflary for transporting the Spanish Troops, Infantry, Gavalry, and Lragoons, with the Artillery, Ammunicion, and Equipages, shall be turnished; but it is understood that this shall be at the Expence of the Spaniards, and fome of His Britannick Majesty's Men of War shall be allowed to convoy them in all Safety to Spain

Spain. XI. The Imbarkation of the Troops shall be at the forementioned Places, and at the Time agreed, the Transports shall be ready to receive them, with the Transports that be ready to receive them, with 40 Days Provisions, as well for the Men as for the Horles, to be reckoned by the ordinary Ration; nor fhall a greater Number of Men be obliged to im-bark on the Transports, than they can hold according to the ordinary Rules; to the End the Men may be at their Eafe in the hot Seafon which is coming on-XVII to that be allowed to the off and transport

XII. It shall be allowed to ship off and transport to Spain with all Security, all the Artillery and Mortars, as well Brass as Iron, which are in the Places of the Kingdom of Sardinia, and were brought from Spain or other Parts fince the Spanish Troops came there; leaving in the Places of the faid Kingdom all the Annunition found there and yet remaining; and all the Annunition found therein when the Spa-nish Troops took Possession, and yet remaining, shall bona fide be given up, it being allowed that all the Amnunition brought from Spain or elsewhere may be impacted.

May be imbarked. XIII. All the Ships, Gallies, and other Imbarkations belonging to Spain, or to its Subjects, which fhall be found in the faid Kingdom, Thall be fuffired to pafs freely to Spain, with their Guns, Crews, and all the Effects they may have on board. It shall likewise be allowed to imbaik all the Artillery, Arms, Anchors, Cordage, Sails, a. d other Effects whate the Declong-ing to the Spanifh Gallies or other Velk is which have been difarmed, or have been wrecked, that fhall be found in the Places which the Spanifh Troops

do now poffes. XIV. The Commiffuries who shall be appointed, shall be permitted to shay in the faid Kingdom, there to fell the Effects which shall remain in the Magazines or elfewhere; as also to take Care of the Sick' who shall not be in a Gondition to imbark with the reft of the Troops, and who when they shall be in a Condition to imbark, shall be turnished with Vessels for carrying them to Spain, at the Charge of the faid Commifaries

Commiffaries. XV. Neither at the Time of the Imbarkation, nor before, nor after, fhall any Deferter be flopt or res-clamed by either Party, nor fhall any Soldier be de-tained on account of his Nation. XVI. All the Officers and Soldiers of the Forces either in Sea or Land Service, who are in Sardinia, and have been made Frifoners during the War of Si-cily and Sardinia, fhall be reflored to the Corps to which they belonged.
