*Malaga, May 10, N. S.*

**Y**ESTERDAY put in here the British Men of War Salisbury and Guernsey, bound home from Turkey; and under their Convoy the following Ships, with which they will sail again the first fair Wind, viz. the Churchill, Sea-Horse, and Cambridge, from Scanderon; the Onflow, Dolphin, Burford, and Elizabeth Hopewell, from Smyrna; the Aleppo-Factor, and King George, from Cyprus.

*Palermo, May 22, N.S.* Transports are getting ready for transporting from hence four Battallions of the King of Sardinia's Troops, which, under the Command of the Baron de St. Remy, are to take Possession for that King of the Island of Sardinia. Preparations are also making, and Measures settled, for the first Imbarcation of the Spanish Troops, which is to consist of about 12000 Foot and 600 Horse.

*Stockholm, May 21, O.S.* The States of this Kingdom have, ever since the Solemnities of the Coronation and Homage were performed, been chiefly busied in settling the Rules and Methods to be for the future observed in their Chancery, and they are yet daily deliberating about the same Affair. All the Merchant Ships which came lately from England and the Sound under Admiral Norris's Convoy, are now come up to this City, where it is reckoned there lye at present upwards of 100 Sail of British Merchant Men, laden with Salt, Corn, and several other kinds of Provisions. Last Week a Proposal was made in the House of the Nobility, that seeing Count Horn was by their unanimous Desire to be restored to his Presidentship in the Chancery, it was but reasonable that Count Cronhielm who at present presides there should be also re-established in his former Presidentship of the College of Commerce, which after some Debate being put to the Vote was carried in Count Cron-

hielm's favour; but upon the Representations since made by Count de la Gardie who at present presides in that College, the States resolved to leave the Decision of the Matter to his Majesty, who has thought fit to confirm Count de la Gardie in that Place. Some Peasants came three Days ago over hither from Ahland, who bring an Account that the Muscovites have entirely abandoned that Island, and are retired with their Gallies, and what Troops they had there, up into the Bothnick Gulf towards Wasa: The British Fleet under Sir John Norris's Command having been joined by the Swedish Admiral at Elsnab with 14 or 15 Ships of the Line, they design to put to Sea with the first fair Wind. His Swedish Majesty went down last Monday Morning to the Dahlers to view the Fleet, and returned on Tuesday in the Afternoon.

*Berne, June 5.* Our Sovereign Council of Two Hundred meets this Day, to give their last Instructions to the Deputies who are to attend the Bishop of Porentru, on the Part of this State, concerning the Differences between that Prelate and the City of Bienne; and they are to set out To-Morrow for the Execution of their Commission. In the next Meeting of the forementioned Great Council, Deputies will be named for the approaching General Diet at Baden; where 'tis believ'd the French Ambassadour the Marquess d'Avarey will likewise assist, his Excellency being expected back from Paris at Soleurre every Day. It is advised from Parma, that upon the Pope's Requisition several of Cardinal Alberoni's Servants had been seized there, and sent to Rome, together with the Papers which had been found in the House of the Prebendary Pertramini, who was an intimate Friend of the Cardinal's, and who upon Advice of that Prelate's Disgrace made his Escape from Parma.

*Paris, June 11, N. S.* On the 7th Instant M. d'Argenson Keeper of the Seals, was

was removed; and the late Chancellor M. d'Aguesseau was reinstated in his Place. On the 9th the Abbot Du Bois was consecrated Archbishop of Cambray.

*St. James's, June 4.* Yesterday M. Welfelski, Resident from the Czar of Muscovy, being recalled by his Master, had a private Audience of Leave of His Majesty, to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable James Earl Stanhope, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies. This Day he had private Audiences of their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, and took his Leave of them, to which he was introduced by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.
