Extract of a Letter from Captain Stewart,
Commander of His Majesty's Ship the Wind-
sor, off the North Foreland, June 17.

THE Enterprize is ordered for the Nore,
by which Ship Sir John Jennings
has sent an Express; yet I think proper
to send this Express to acquaint you, that
the King with all the Yachts got safe
into Helvoetsluys on Thursday Morning
about Six a-Clock, and Sir John Jen-
nings followed His Majesty in the Bid-
deford.
