#### THE SCHEDULE

Description of highway to be stopped up

The highway to be stopped is in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets. It is shown edged black on the plan and is part of the south-western footway of Whitechapel High Street between Colchester Street and Commercial Road.

The highway areas are four small strips with varying maximum widths between 0.4 and 0.6 metres, with maximum lengths of 1.4 and 4.7 metres respectively.

The stopping up is to facilitate development of a new office building and to amend the highway boundary to reflect the proposed building line.

The stopping up also forms part of a wider development which will provide for the realignment of the existing Aldgate gyratory system and the creation of a new city park which will form one of the Mayor's 100 open spaces in London.

#### THE STOPPING UP OF HIGHWAYS (LONDON BOROUGH OF TOWER HAMLETS) (NO.2 ) ORDER 2007

Made 5th December 2007

The London Borough of Tower Hamlets makes this Order in exercise of its powers under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 ("the Act"), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf:

1. The London Borough of Tower Hamlets authorises the stopping up of the area of highway described in the schedule to this Order and shown solid black on the deposited plan in order to enable development to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted under Part III of the Act to DP9 Ltd by the London Borough of Tower Hamlets on 10th July 2007 under reference PA/06/00510.
2. Where immediately before the date of this order there is any apparatus of statutory undertakers under, in, on, over, along or across any area of highway authorised to be stopped up pursuant to this Order then, subject to section 261(4) of the Act, those undertakers shall have the same rights as respects that apparatus after that area of highway is stopped up as they had immediately beforehand.
3. In this Order "the plan" means the plan numbered "20.04/515-3/2007" marked "Highway in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets", signed by authority of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets and deposited in Transportation & Highways, Mulberry Place, 5 Clove Crescent, London E14 2BG.
4. This Order shall come into force on the date on which notice that it has been made is first published in accordance with section 252(10) of the Act, and may be cited as the Stopping up of Highways (London Borough of Tower Hamlets) (No.2) Order 2007.
