Stockholm, June 11, O. S.
ON the 9th Instant the Lord Carteret, his Britannick Majesty's Ambassador, had his Audience of Leave of the King and Queen of Sweden at Carlberg, where his Excellency had the Honour to dine the same Day with their Majesties: That Afternoon the King with the Prince his Brother set out from thence to take the Diversion of Bear-Hunting near Upsala, whence it is thought his Majesty will go on to Gasse to view the Body of Troops incamped in that Neighbourhood under the Command of General Hamilton. On the 4th Instant the King sent a Letter to the States, wherein he acquainted them, that considering it is uncertain when a Peace can be made with their Enemies, and that it may perhaps in the mean while be necessary to form an Army abroad, in order to obtain Terms more honourable than have yet been offered; and seeing by the Instrument of Government he has obliged himself not to go out of the Kingdom without the Consent of the States; and as it was likely they would soon finish what they think necessary to do in this Session; he therefore desired to know whether the States would not before they separate leave him at Liberty to go and command any Army that may be formed abroad for the formentioned Purpose, in case his Majesty and the Senate of the Kingdom judge it to be for the publick Good. The Resolution of the States hereupon is expected. We have Advices from the Province of Wetter-Bothnia, that the Muscovites are gone from Uma, but whether they be retired over to Finland or gone higher up the Gulph is yet uncertain.

General Post-Office, London, June 27, 1720.

These are to give Notice, that the Post will go every Night (Saudays excepted) from London to Tunbridge, and from Tunbridge-Wells to London, from Friday the 1st of July Instant inclusive, during the Summer Season, as usual.

By Order of the Commissioners of Excise.

Notice is hereby given, that by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, if after the 24th Day of June 1720, Corn making into Malt is steeped, wetted, or watered upon the Couch or Floor, or in any other Place but in the Cisterns and Uring-Fats duly entered for that purpose, the Offender forfeits 2 s. 6 d. per Bushel. Or if Corn making into Malt is suffered or made to acrespire, the Officers are to take one handful thereof, and if more than one Part in fifteen thereof is acrespired, the inquire wetting from whence the same shall be taken shall be charged with the Duty of 6 d. per Bushel, without any Allowance in respect of its being charged on the Floor or elsewhere, and the Offender forfeits the further Sum of 5 s. per Bushel for all such Corn. If unmalted Oats, or Barley are found mixed with Malt shipping or shipped for Exportation, the Person shipping, or causing such Mixture to be shipped, forfeits 5 s. per Bushel. Exporters of Malt now giving to Part Officers of Excise, to be appointed for that purpose, 48 Hours Notice in Writing before beginning to ship such Malt for Exportation, forfeits 5 s. per Bushel. Such as oppose, molest, hinder, or obstruct Officers of Excise in the due Execution of the Powers, &c. in this or any other Act relating to the Duties of Excise, forfeits 10 l. for every such Offence. If Corn steeping or steeped

in any Cistern or Utting-Fat in order to the making thereof into Malt, is found so hard, close and compact, as it could not be wales by some Means or other it had been forced together, the Malster, &c. forfeits 2 s. 6 d. per Bushel. On Appeals, the Justices at the Quarter-Sessions, are to re-hear, re-examine, and reconsider the Truth and Merits of the Fact and Facts in question, and to re-examine the Witnesses, and are finally to determine of and concerning the Truth and Merits of such Fact and Facts; and if any Defect or Defects of Form are found in the Proceedings, the same shall be rectify'd and amended by order of the Justices at such Quarter-Sessions.

Stamp-Office, Lincolns-Inn, June 28, 1720.

The Commissioners for managing His Majesty's Stamp Duties have thought fit to give Notice, That by a Clause in an Act of the last Sessions of Parliament for laying a Duty upon Wroughts Plate, &c. All Masters and Mistresses who have formerly omitted to pay His Majesty's Duties on Monies given, paid, or contracted for, with Clerks and Apprentices within the respective Times limited by the several Acts of Parliament in that Case made, are acquitted and discharged of and from all Penalties incurred by such Omissions, provided they pay the said Duties on or before the 29th Day of September 1720. And for preventing the like Omissions for the future, the said Commissioners do hereby further give Notice, that the Times limited by the Act of Parliament which grants the said Duties for Payment thereof, are within one Month after the Dates of such Indentures or Contracts as are executed within the Limits of the Bills of Mortality, and within two Months after the Dates of such Indentures or Contracts as are executed elsewhere throughout the Kingdom of Great Britain. And that on Neglect of such Payment within the respective Times above-mentioned, every Master or Mistress so neglecting, incurs a Penalty of 50 l. with Costs of Suit; and the Clerk or Apprentice is made incapable of exercising the intended Trade or Employment, or of being made Free of any City, Corporation, or Company, and the Indentures and Contracts are also in such Case void and of no Effect. The said Commissioners do further give Notice, that all Persons neglecting or refusing to comply with the Terms of the said Acts of Parliament, will be prosecuted for the same.
