II E General Diet of the Helvetick Bo-dy, which meets regularly once a Year foon after Midfummer, is now going to affemble at Frawenfelt, and the Deputies from all the Cantons will repair thither in very few Days. We have no News as yet of the Return of the French Ambassadour from his Court, fo that in Cafe his Absence continues, the usual Compliments to the faid Diet will be made by M. de la Martiniere, Secretary of the French Embaffy, on the Part of his Excellency ; which Secretary will attend the Diet in Perfon to that End. The Perfons deputed by this Canton to go and enquire into the Damage fulfained by the Inhabitants of Thun, a little Town about four Leagues from hence, occasioned by a fudden Inundation of the Lake of that Name, being returned hither, have made their Report to the Sovereign Council, and it is now under Deliberation how to indemnify the poor Sufferers, many of whom are reduced to the utmost Distress. On Sunday last a general Collection was made throughout this City and Part of the Canton, for repairing the great Lofs fuftained at Lausanne, and in that Neighbourhood, by the Fempest of Hail and Wind that happened there the 7th paft, in which above 200 Acres of Vin-yards, 1000 Fruit Trees, and 2000 other Trees were destroyed, besides other considerable Damage done to the City of Laufanne, and the adjacent Villages. The folemn Deputation that went three Weeks ago on the Part of this Canton to the Bifhop of Porentru, to mediate a Peace be-tween that Prelate and his Subjects of Bienne, are ftill there, and it is not yet known when those Deputies will have finished their Commission, by reason of the Difficulties they meet with on that Subject.

Stuckholm, June 18, O. S. The Muscovite Gallies which made lately the Ravages in the Bothnick Gulf about Uma, paffed the laft Week between the Islands on the Finnish Coast and the Continent, and retired towards Wyburg and Peters-burg. On the 15th Inftant the Archbishop of Upfal, and a Committee of Ten of the Clergy, waited on the King to reprefent the Inconveniences their whole Order fuffers by the long Continuance of the prefent Affembly of the States, and to pray that they may be difmiffed as foon as poffible; and the Peafants having made like Complaint, it is probable an End will be put to this Seffion next Week, though as yet no Anlwer has been given to the King's last Letter.

Copenhagen, July 6, N. S. On the 29th past the Lord Carteret, his Britannick Majefty's Ambastadour, arrived at Fredericksbourg. His Excellency having brought with him the Treaty of Peace between Denmark and Sweden, agreed to and figned on the part of Sweden, that Treaty was, after a Conference on the 1st and another on the 2d Inftant with the Danish Ministers, agreed to like-wife by the King of Denmark, and figned by his Minister Plenipotentiary on the 3d.

Paris, July 13. The Congress for the Peace with Spain is appointed to be held at Cambray, and an Act is to be figned here by the Ministers of the Powers engaged in the War, for the fixing the Time when the Plenipotentiaries are to meet there. It is advifed from Sicily, that the first Imbarkation of the Spanish Troops, to the Number of 12000 Men, failed on the 17th pass for Spain. The Marshal de Villars is by Order retired from Court to his Country Seat at Villars.
