NOTICE is hereby given that Bedfordshire County Council, the Highway Authority, intends to apply to Bedford & Mid Bedfordshire Magistrates' Court sitting at 3 St Paul's Square Bedford on **Thursday 5 June 2008 at 2.00 pm** for an Order under Section 116 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising the stopping up of part of the area located on the north side of the road between Barton-Le-Clay and Shillington that is the classified highway C140 known as Higham Road some 500 metres to the north-east of the village of Higham Gobion in the Parish of Shillington in the District of Mid Bedfordshire on the ground that it is unnecessary.

That area of Highway to be stopped-up lies immediately to the west of the watercourse on the west side of 1 Higham Cottages. It extends from the west end of the parapet of the bridge over the stream for a distance of 122 metres westwards. The northern boundary of the stopping-up follows the line of the existing highway boundary. From the west end of the parapet of the bridge over the stream the southern boundary follows the line of the existing field gate. At the parking area the southern boundary is set back 1 metre from the northern kerb line and 2 metres back from the drain headwall. From this location to the western end the southern boundary is set back 4 metres from the North Channel of Higham Road.

STOPPING UP OF PART OF SUNDERLAND ROAD, SANDY, BEDFORDSHIRE

NOTICE is hereby given that Bedfordshire County Council, the Highway Authority, intends to apply to Bedford & Mid Bedfordshire Magistrates' Court sitting at 3 St Paul's Square Bedford on **Thursday 29 May 2008 at 2.00pm** for an Order under Section 116 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising the stopping up of part of the north side of the unclassified road UC391 Sunderland Road to the north east of the town of Sandy in the parish of Sandy in the District of Mid Bedfordshire. The area of highway is known as bridleway BW21 which lies immediately north of the roundabout on the junction with Sunderland Road and Beamish Close, which extends from the northern edge of the roundabout along BW21 for a distance of 65 metres in a north west direction. Planning**Town and Country Planning****Bedford Borough Council****PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990, SECTION 69****BLETSOE CONSERVATION AREA**

Notice is given under the provisions of the 1990 Act that Bedford Borough Council has determined that the area described in the Schedule to this Notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest, and that it is desirable to preserve or enhance its character or appearance. It has accordingly designated the area as a 'Conservation Area'.

The principal effects of this area being designated as a Conservation Area are as follows:

1. The Council is under a duty to prepare proposals to ensure the preservation or enhancement of the area.
2. Conservation Area Consent will now be required for the demolition of all unlisted buildings (other than excepted buildings) in the area.
3. Special publicity must be given to planning applications for development in the area.
4. In carrying out any functions under the planning Acts (and, in particular, in determining applications for planning permission and listed building consent), the Council and the Secretary of State are required to take into account the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area.
5. Six weeks' notice must be given to the Council before works are carried out to any tree in the area.

SCHEDULE**Bletsoe Conservation Area**

The Bletsoe Conservation Area in its northern part encompasses Bletsoe Castle and much of its grounds including the garden earthworks. The Castle Barns and properties on Coplow Lane up to Herdsman's Cottage are also included. St Mary's Church and the adjacent paddock are within the boundary, as are all the properties on Oldway and Top Row. In the southern part of the village, Memorial Lane up to
