THE Earl Stanhope arrived here last Night. He has had this Morning Audiences of the King and Queen of Prussia, who were pleased to express very particular Satisfaction on his coming hither. General Mayer, the Danish Envoy, has notified in form to this Court the Treaty of Peace concluded between his Master and the Crown of Sweden.

Copenhagen, July 20, N. S. The Lord Carteret, His Britannick Majesty's Ambassadour, having sent from hence a Messenger to Stockholm, with an Act, formed here at his Danish Majesty's Desire, containing an Explanation of the Treaty between Denmark and Sweden, that Messenger returned hither on the 17th Instant, with the said Act approved and signed by the Swedish Plenipotentiaries, and also with the Ratification of it. Thus the Peace between this Crown and that of Sweden, is, by the Interposition and good Offices of His Britannick Majesty, intirely concluded and settled. The King of Denmark has begun to evacuate Pomerania: Prince Charles's Regiment of two Battallions, commanded by Colonel Schach, is arrived here from Stralsund.

Paris, July 27. The Parliament have not yet begun their Session at Pontoise, but have had some private Meetings to prepare Matters for that Purpose. They are to hold their Assemblies in a Convent of the Cordeliers, where the Clergy used formerly to assemble. The Premier President and others of the Chief of that Body are lodged in a House belonging to the Duke D'Albert, at the Abbey St. Martin; and the rest in the principal Houses of the Town and Country round it. Most of the Presidents are to keep open Table; to enable them to do which, the Government has paid them and the rest of the Counsellours 200000 Livres for Bills of 10000 and 1000 Livres, and has promised to repeat the same Favour in a little time. On the 25th Mr. Law returned from the Palais Royal, where he had continued ever since the Tumult which happened on the 17th, to his own House.
