NESTLE/ROWNTREE CONSERVATION AREA

Notice is given under the provision of the 1990 Act that the Council of the City of York had determined that the area described in the schedule to this notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest, and that it is desirable to preserve or enhance its character or appearance. It has accordingly designated this area a "conservation area".

The effect of the designation of the conservation area is to introduce additional controls upon: the demolition, erection or alteration of buildings; the demolition of walls; works to trees; work by telecommunications operators; the display of illuminated advertisements; permitted development rights are restricted; grants and loans may be payable; planning applications which affect the character of the area must be advertised for public comment; the local planning authority have a duty to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area, and also to form proposals for the protection and enhancement of the area.

Schedule: Boundary of the Nestle/Rowntree Conservation Area Nestle/Rowntree Conservation Area was designated on 17 December 2007. It lies roughly 1.5 kilometres north of the city centre, centered on Haxby Road, and encompasses some of the earliest and most distinctive buildings erected in the early 20th century by the Rowntree family, either as part of the Rowntree chocolate factory or for wider public enjoyment. The boundary to the south is Hambleton Terrace, going north through the factory site to Haxby Road and Yearsley Baths then south to Haley's Terrace and Nuffield Hospital.

A map showing the extent of the conservation area may be inspected, free of charge, during normal office hours at the Office Reception, 9 St Leonard's Place, York YO1 7ET.

EXTENSION OF THE BOUNDARY OF TODMORDEN CONSERVATION AREA

EXTENSION OF THE BOUNDARY OF LUMBUTTS AND MANKINHOLES CONSERVATION AREA

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 10th March 2008 the Metropolitan Borough of Calderdale determined that the areas described in the Schedules to this Notice shall be designated as Conservation Areas, under Section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, thereby varying those existing Conservation Area boundaries.

The principal effect of conservation area designation is that special attention is to be paid to the need to preserve or enhance the character or appearance of these areas. In particular, the following apply:

1. In carrying out any functions under the Planning Acts, the Council and the Secretary of State are required to take into account the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area.
2. Consent will be required for the demolition of buildings (other than exempted buildings), and walls exceeding certain heights, in the area.
3. Planning applications for development which would, in the Council's opinion, affect the character or appearance of the conservation area must be given special publicity.
4. Six weeks notice must be given to the Council before works are carried out to any tree in the area.
5. Permitted development rights relating to extensions to dwelling houses, the siting of satellite dishes and the erection of outbuildings are reduced.
6. The Council is under a duty to prepare proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the area.
