Lisbon, August 5.

ON the 31st past the Pernambuco Fleet, with a Ship from Macao, arrived here. It is said it brings about three Millions of Cruasies in Gold; besides Sugar, Tobacco, and other Commodities.

Sto. kholm, Aug. 3. On the 27th and 28th past came several Letters from the Swedish Squadron under Baron Wachtmeister, which all confirm the Account given in our former of the unlucky Ren-counter some of the Ships under his Command had with the Muscovite Gallies: But they make the Number of the latter to be far beyond what was at first related, besides three or four large Prahmes, and abundance of small Sloops. The Swedes also suffered more in the Action than was at first reported, having lost four Frigates in all. The last Post from Carlscroon has brought an Account of an unfortunate Accident that happened there last Week, by an House taking Fire where they were baking Bread for the Use of the Navy, which being near to the Magazine of naval Stores, set Fire to that also, and did great Damage. It is said the Court will return from Carlsberg to Town next Week; and it is talk'd the King may make 4 Progress to Scho-nen as soon as the Ratifications of the Treaty of Peace with Denmark are exchanged; which Journey may probably enough produce an Interview between the two Kings.

Copenhagen, Aug. 10, N. S. The King of Den-mark returned hither last Night, having instead of making his designed long Journey, contented him-self with making the Tour of Zealand in 9 Days, ac-companied by the Lord Carteret the British Ambassa-dour. He reviewed some Regiment or other of Horse every Day; which made a very good Appear-ance; and their Number within this Island is com-pleat 5000. Here are likewise 39 Battalions, and one more will come hither from Stralsund when that Place is evacuated. The Lord Carteret received Yesterday a Letter from the King of Sweden to his Britannick Majesty, and also one to the King of Denmark, which last his Lordship delivered immediately. His Daugh-tress Majesty was well satisfied with it, and has already written to the Czar, and offered his Commendation with the King of Great Britain, for a Peace between the Czar and Sweden.

Hanover, Aug. 22, N. S. On the 18th Instant in the Evening the King of Prussia arrived at Herren-hausen, and was received by His Britannick Majesty with all Marks of Affection. On the 21st their Brit-annick and Prussian Majesties with his Royal High-ness the Duke of York came hither, and did Earl Stanhope the Honour to dine with him.

Hague, Aug. 27. The Earl of Stair arrived here here last Night, and will stay a Day or two: But Mr. Schaub, who came over with him, continued his Journey immediately for Hanover.

Whitehall, Aug. 18, 1720.

The Lords Justices having received a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and thereupon taking into Consideration the great Trade now carrying on in the Buying and Selling of Stocks not Warranted by Law, which must unavoidably turn to the Destruction of Publick Credit, and to the Ruin of Trade, and of many private Families who unwisely engage therein: Notwithstanding His Majesty out of His tender Regard to the Good of His Subjects, had, by his Royal Proclamation of the 11th of June last, given sufficient Warning of the severe Penalties that would be incurred by such Practises; which are such Fines, Penalties, and Punishments, whereunto Persons convicted for common and publick Nufances are by any of the Laws and Statutes of this Realm subject and liable; and moreover, such further Pains, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as were ordained and provided by the Statute of Provison and Praemunire made in the 16th Year of King Richard II, viz. Forfeiture of Lands and Tenements, Goods and Chat-tels, and Imprisonment, and a Penalty of 500 l.
