By the Lords Juffices, W. Cant. Iownfbend P. Grafton, Polton, PROCLAMATION A Requiring Quarentine to be performed by Ships

Coming from the Mediterranean. Hereas Information hath been given, that Mar-filles, and other bland in the Marfilles, and other Places in the Mediterrancan, are infected with the Plague; and we, out of our ten-der Care of His Maj fly's People, and to prevent the In-feftion that might be by Ships coming into His Majefty's Posts from any of the faid Places, by our Order in Council made this twenty fifth Day of August, one thousand feven bundred and swenty, in the seventh Year of His Myssfy's Reign, bave directed and required, that all Ships, and Perfons coming in the fame from the Medi-terranean, fall perform their Quarentine in fuch Man-ner and in luch Places as in and by the fail Order are directed : Now to the Intent that no Perf n whomfgever may pretend Ignorance of our Command therein, we have thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Majefy's Privy-ouncil, and we do by this Proclamation, purfu-ont to an AEt made in the ninth Year of the Reign of Her late Maj fly Queen Anne, Interuied, An AA to oblige Ships coming from Places infected, more effectually to perform their Quarentine, give Nosice of the faid Order; and do require that all Perfons do yield sxaft Obedience to the fame, viz. 1. That all Ships or Veffels arriving in any Ports of

this Kinzdom from the Miditerranean, do make their Quarentine for forsy Days, which shall be reckoned and comm nee from the Day each Ship fhall come to Ar chor in the Place appointed for performing fuch Quarentine, and not before.

2. That the Places for performing Quarentine by Such Ships bound to the River of Thames and Medway, be Standgate-Greek on the South Shore of the River Med-way, opposite to the Isle of Grain, Shapfleet-Greek, and the lower end of the Hope; and by Juch Ships coming into any other of the Ports of Great Britain, be Juch Places as shall be appointed by the Officers of H's Mije-fty's Cufforns in such Ports, who are impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the fame.

3. That until and during the time for making fach Quarentine, no Perfon coming, or Goods imported in any fuch Ship, shall come on Shore, or be landed in any Place within this Kingdom.

4. That if, at the Expiration of the Quarentine bere-by airected to be made, there shall appear to the Officers of His Majesty's Customs in the respective Places where fuch Ships shall be, and the Master or other Persons ta-king Gharge of fuch Ships, together with two other Per-carhelenging on the faid Ship they make on the face fing Grarge of juich Ships, sugarder wird two shiels est-fons belonging to the faid Ship, thall make Oath before the Cuftomer, Comptroller, or Collector of the Port where fuch Quarentine thall be performed, or the next Port thereunto, or before any of their Deputies, and any one Juffice of the Peace near adjoining to fuch Port, that Could be and all and ansay Parlon and Perfors therein fuch Ship, and all and every Perfon and Perfons therein, have duly performed their Quarentine, as aforefaid, and that the Ship or Veffel, and all the Perfous on Board, are free from Infection, that then the respective Persons coming in fuch Ships, (a Certificate of fuch Oaths being made by the Perfons before whom the fame fall be taken) shall be permitted to go on Shore; but the Goods imported in fuch Ships shall be landed, opened, and aired, and fo remain a Week, and after may be brought to their Places of Difcharge, other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk Raw, Thrown or Wrought, Linnen, Osten-Wooll, Cotton in Yarn, or manufactured, Wooll raw, or in any wife wrought, Feathers, Grograin, or. Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, or Carmenia Wooll, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Skins in the Wooll, or Hair; which the Of-ficers of His Majefty's Cuftems shall caufe to remain on Bard othe Shing and the terms in the bard till of Board fuch Ships, and not permit to be landed till an Account thereof jhall be given to us in Council, and Or-

Acts shall be given by us concerning the same. 5. That the Place for landing and airing, the Goods imported from the Meditorramean, and designed for the

River Thames, fhall be the Island of Stowfort in the River Medway; and in other Ports in this Kingdom, fuch Places as fball be appointed ly His Majelty's Officers of the Cufloms, in Conjunction with the refrective Chief Magificates there.

6. That what ever Ship or Perfon shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Sh p or V.ffel under Quarensine, shall be compelled to do the like Quarentine.

7. That Juck Perfons as, after Quarentine performed, shall be employed in the Hold of any fuch Ship, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain to festion from Herp and Flaz, Paper or Bucks, Silk raw, thrown and wrought Linnen, Gotton-Wooll, Cotton-Yarn, or manufattured, Wooll raw, or in any wife wrought, Feathers, Grograins, or Mobair Tarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, or Carmenia Wooll, Garpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufastures of Silk and Cotton, Skins in the Woll, or Hair thereon, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarentine.

That the Captains of every His Majofity's Ships of War, who fhall meet any fuch Ships coming to any Ports in this Kingdom, fhall take due Care to prevent the landing any Goods, Seamen, or Pallengers thereins until they full be put under the Lirection of His Ma-jefty's Officers of the Customs.

9. That the Commillioners and other Officers of His Majeft)'s Cuftoms do use their utmost Diligence and Care that the Quarentine, before directed, be duly performed.

And we do bereby firitly charge and command all Perfonswhatsoever, that shall come into any of the Ports of this Kingdom from the Mediterranean, that they do make their Quarentine according to our Order herein before expressed ; and that, during the time of their Quarentine, they do not prefume to come or put any Goods out of fuch Ships on Shore, nor permit or fuffer any Person to come on Board fuch Ships; and that all Persons, other than fuch as bill be appointed to take Care that the Juarentine be duly performed, do not go on Board, or receive any Goods from such Ships, till they shall be dif-charged from their Quarentine, as berein before directed, receive any Goods from juck Scaps, this projective any Goods from juck Scaps, this project directed, when Pain of heing proceed direction before directed, upon Pain of heing proceed direction before directed, severity that the Lacu will allow of, for difoleying our Commands berein, fo neceffary for fecuring the Health of His Majefty's Subjects. And we do bereby command the Commillioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, and Commil-fioners of His Majefty's Customs, that they do take Care and give the neceffary Directions, that the faid Order be put in Execution, and duly Obferved. And We do likewife firitly charge and command the Com-manders of His Majefty's Subjes of War, the Comman-ders of His Majefty's Forts and Garrifons lying near His Majefty's Sea-Coafts, and all His Majefty's Fuffices of the Peace, Mayors, Sherifs, Bailiffs, Chief Magiftrates, Conftables, Headboroughs, Tythingmen, and all other Officers and Ministers of Fus Majefty's Customs, and to all other Perfons that fhall be concerned in ftopping Ships coming from the Mediterranean, and in stopping Ships coming from the Mediterranean, and bringing them to the Places appointed for, and obliging them to perform their Quarentine, in the due Execution of our Commands herein.

From on board the Rupert, in the Road of Leg-borne, Aug. 12. Admiral Byng arrived here laft Night from Cagliari in Sardinia.
