HE King of Pruffis fer out from He-renhaufen Yesterday Morning, to return to his own Dominions; a tripple Discharge of the Cannon on our Ramparts being made at his Departure. The King has been pleafed to appoint the Earl Stanhope; the Lord Carteret, and Sir Rubert Sutton, to be his Majefty's Ambaffadours Extraordinary and Plenipotentiaries at the Congress at Cambray. His Majefty has been pleafed to conflitute the Lord Polwarth, who has for fome Years refided at Copenhagen with the Character of his Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary, his Ambaffadour to the King of Denmark.

l'aris, Sepr. 4, N. S. On the 2d Inftant at Night, the Duke Regent lay for the firft time in his Apartments in the Palace of the Tulleries, and was at the King's Levce Yefterday Morning ; after which his Royal Highnels held a Council of the Finances in his own Apartment, at which the Marshal de Villeroy assisted. The Parliament at Pontoile having put off the Examination of the King's Declaration touching the Agrees ment of the Difputes upon the Pope's Conflitution, from one Day to another, affem-bled at length on Monday last, and ap-pointed 10 Commissioners to examine the fame, and make their Report thereupon to the Company. On that Occasion two Petitions or Protestations were pielented, the one on the Part of the University of Paria, and the other from the four Bishops who first made their Appeal to the future General Council. 'Tis faid the Faculty of Theology will put in a feparate Petition. The Parliament had Yesterday this Affair under Confideration; but some Debates arifing, they have put it off again till To-Morrow. 'Tis faid, that the Abbot de St. Albin is named to carry the Accommodation to the Pope, in cafe the Parliament agrees to it. On the 31st past a solemn Service was celebrated in the Royal Chappel for the Repose of the Soul of the late King 5 and on the 2d Instant the same was performed at St. Denis, the Marthals Villeroy and Villars, who were conducted thither in one of the King's Coaches, allifting in his Majefty's Name at that Cere-Count Bicike, Envoy Extraordinary mony uf Sweden, had Yesterday his first Audience of the King. M. Boulquin; Chamberlain of the Czar, is arrived here with Letter's from his Mafter to the King and the Duke Regent. An Arrêt is published for allowing 1500 Bales of Coffee, lately brought from Moca on Account of private Traders at St. Malo, under the Privilege of the Old India Company, to be fold within the Kingdom (the prefent Company having an exclusive Privilege

for felling all Commodities from the Indies ;] and at the fame time it is forbidden to carry ny Coffee out of the Kingdum, till the King shall order otherwise.

Whereas by the det to prevent Frands; pajled the 14th Teav of Charles II it is entited, That if any Goods; Wares, or Merchandizes, fhall be inipped, or put on board to be carried forth to the open Sca from any one Port of this Kingdom, to be landed at any other Place of this Realm, without a Sufferance or Warrant first had and obtained from the Officers of his Majefly's Cultoms, all fuch Wares, and Merchandizes fhall be forfeited and loft And y another Ast poffed the 9th Year of His prefent Majefty, Entituded, An Ast against claudefine Rumning of unaccustomed Goods, Ore-it is enserved, That in Cale any Foreign Goods, Wares, or Merchan line, Goll to any Collis to Eligen base or Merchandizes, that in Cate any Foreign Goods, wares, or Merchandizes, thall by any Collier, Fifther boars or other coafting Veffel or Boat be taken in at Sea, or out of any Ship or Veffel whatfoever, in order to be handed, or put into any other Ship, Veffel, or Boats, within the Limits of any Port, without Payment of the Cuffoms, and other Dures due and payable for the Guffoms, and other Dures due and payable for the fame, fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, shall be forfeited, and the Mafter of fuch Collier, Fisherz boat, or other coaffing Vellel or Boat, thall forfeit treble the Value of fuch Goods, unle is in Cate of Necessity, which fuch Master thall immediately give Notice of, and make Proof before the chiel Officers of the Cultoms of the first Port of this Kingdom where he shall arrive; and the Master, Purfer, or other Per-fon taking Charge of the Ship or Yessel out of which fuch Goods shall be taken in at Sea, unless in Gate of Necessity, as a forefaid, shall forter treble the Va-lne of such Goods for unshipped, one Moiety of which Forfeiture to be for the use of his Majesty, his Heirs and Successor. and Succeffors, and the other Moiety to hm, her, or them, who will inform or fac for the fame. The Commillioners of His Majesty's Customs finding that many braudt are still carried on by Ships and Veljels trading Coastwife, to the Prejudice of the Revenue, and the face Traders, notwithstanding the Acts before mentioned, they do hereby give publick Notice of the Per natties influcted by the faid Atts, that no Person may pretend Ignovance.
