

(j) residents short stay visitors' permit (valid for two hours)	All vehicles	20p for two hours permit (£2.40 per set of 12 permits)	N/A
(k) residents weekend visitors' permit (valid noon Friday for 72 hours)	All vehicles	£2.50 each	N/A
(l) residents long stay visitors' permit (valid for 14 days)	All vehicles	£4.00 each	N/A

The permits for the controlled parking zone would only be valid in the zone for which they are issued. The maximum annual entitlement of visitors' permits would be 720 short stay permits, 12 weekend visitor permits and 2 long stay permits. The maximum annual entitlement for residents aged 60 would be 1440 short stay permits, 24 weekend visitor permits and 4 long stay permits.

4. The further effects of the Orders would be:-

(a) to designate residents parking places, on certain lengths of the streets specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice, operative between 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, where vehicles displaying a valid residents parking permit or a disabled person's badge would be permitted to wait without time limit;

(b) to designate shared use residents and business parking places, on certain lengths of the streets specified in Schedule 3 to this Notice, operative between 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, where vehicles displaying a valid residents parking permit or a disabled person's badge would be permitted to wait without time limit;

(c) impose waiting restrictions operative at any time, on certain lengths of the streets specified in Schedule 4 to this Notice.

5. Copies of the proposed Order, the Order being amended, of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order, together with plans and more detailed particulars showing the locations and effects of the Order can be inspected during normal office working hours, until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Order are made or as the case may be, the Council decides not to make the Order, at Highways Management Group, 1st Floor South, River Park House, 225 High Road, N22 8HQ.

6. Notice is hereby given that the High Peak Borough Council propose to make the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of the Order will be to revoke the High Peak Borough Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Orders 1998 – 2007.

The Order re-enacts the provisions of the 1998 – 2007 Orders but with additional provisions to reflect the transfer of Civil Parking Enforcement powers from the Police to the Borough Council. The level of charges applicable at the various car parks will be unaltered and the prescribed level of charge for Penalty Charge Notices will be at the nationally prescribed levels of £70 and £50.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A38 TRUNK ROAD (SWINFEN, STAFFORDSHIRE) (CLOSURE OF GAP IN THE CENTRAL RESERVATION) ORDER 2008

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 1(1) and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on a length of the A38 Trunk Road at Swinfen, Lichfield in the County of Staffordshire.

The effect of the Order, which comes into force on 24 October 2008, will be to close the gap in the central reservation of the A38 opposite its junction with Old London Road and Barkers Lane.
