Genoa, September 11.

THE Plague continuing at Marseilles, this Republick keeps 8000 Men continually under Arms to guard the Coasts, with Orders to fire on any that shall endeavour to land without Bills of Health, to certify that they do not come from Places infected with the Plague, or under Suspicion; and this Rigour is used even against the Subjects of the Republick. The like is practised by the other States of Italy; and if any are caught endeavouring to get in by Stealth, they are to be punished with Death, without Tryal or Hopes of Pardon.

Berlin, Sept. 17. The King of Prussia received last Week a Letter from the Emperour, inviting him to send a Minister to the Congress at Brunswick: And that there may be no further Delay in this Affair, the first of November is proposed by his Imperial Majesty, to be the Day for Opening the said Congress. As this Court intends to conform themselves to the King of Great Britain's Sentiments on this Occasion, their Answer to the Emperour's Invitation is deferred till His Britannick Majesty's Resolution upon it be known. Baron Schonck, the Duke of Wirtemberg's first Minister, arrived here some Days ago, but has not as yet notified his Arrival to any of the foreign Ministers: His Commission is to solicit the King of Prussia's Consent to his Master's sending of a Body of Troops into the Service of Sweden. The Regard shewn by the Duke of Wirtemberg for his Prussian Majesty on this Occasion, is founded on a Treaty by which he is obliged to furnish a Body of 3000 Men, whenever this Court shall think proper to require them; and therefore to prevent any Misunderstanding, Baron Schonck is dispatched hither, previously to acquaint his Prussian Majesty with the Engagements the said Duke is entering into, and to ask his Approbation and Consent.

Hanover, Sept. 9. His Majesty, Prince Frederick, and the Duke of York, continue in good Health. Count Sparr arrived here Yesterday from Stockholm: The King of Sweden has added to his Character of Envoy that of Plenipotentiary; Count Gyllenbourg, who was appointed by the Court of Sweden to go to the Congress of Brunswick, is recalled to Stockholm.

Hague, Sept. 24. The States General have published a Placard, ordering that all Ships coming from the Coasts of Provence and Languedoc shall repair to the Texel or the Vlie, and no where else, to perform Quarantine, Almost all the Towns and Villages of the Province of Holland having set up Companies of Insurance and Commerce, the City of Amsterdam after having long forborn, has at last resolved to erect a Company of Insurance, and to give it to the West-India Company. The Commissioners named some time ago, to examine into the State of the Revenues and Debts of the Province of Holland, are very busy in taken the necessary Informations: And it is said they will be able to make their Report at the next Meeting of the States. The Directors of the West-India Company are daily expected here, to solicit the States General for a small Detachment of Troops, to be employed to retake a Fort on the Coast of Africa, which they bought last Year of the King of Prussia, but is still in the Possession of the Moors, who were Masters of it at the Time of the Sale.

All Masters and Mistresses who have formerly omitted to pay His Majesty's Duties, on Minies given, pay'd, or contracted for with Clerks and Apprentices, within the respective Times limited by the several Acts of Parliament in that Case made, are acquitted and discharged of and from all Penalties incurr'd by such Omissions, provided they pay the said Duties on or before the 29th of September 1720.
