LONDON BOROUGH OF WALTHAM FOREST - PARKING CHARGE AMENDMENTS SECTION 46A NOTICE AND

THE WALTHAM FOREST (CHINGFORD LANE CPZ) (PARKING PLACES) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2008 VARIATION (NO. 1) 2008

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the "Council" of the London Borough of Waltham Forest intend to amend the charges for certain parking permits and associated costs, under section 46A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and in accordance with section 25 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996.

2. The existing qualifying age for a free book of 30 zone based, 1 hour, visitor permits (which allow vehicles to be parked in the respective CPZ permit bays in the London Borough of Waltham Forest) is 70 or over. This will be increased to 75 or over and will come into effect on the 8th December 2008.

3. FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 14th November the Council made The Waltham Forest (Chingford Lane CPZ) (Parking Places) Experimental Traffic Order 2008 Variation

(No. 1) 2008 under sections 9 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of the Order will vary the provisions of The Waltham Forest (Chingford Lane CPZ) (Parking Places) Experimental Traffic Order 2008 (hereafter referred to as "the Chingford Lane CPZ Order") to include the new visitor permit charging provision outlined in paragraph 2 and which will come into force on the 8th December 2008.

4. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order and of the Chingford Lane CPZ order are available for inspection between 9.30 am and 4.30 pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive (except Bank Holidays), from 14th November 2008 until the Orders cease to have effect, at (a) The Information Desk, Town Hall, Forest Road, Walthamstow, E17; (b) The Waltham Forest Direct Shop, 772-776 High Road, Leyton, E10; and (c) Low Hall, Argall Avenue, London, E10 7AS.

5. The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the Chingford Lane CPZ Order should be continued in force indefinitely by means of a permanent Order made under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Any person may object to the making of the permanent Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months beginning with the day on which the above mentioned variation Order came into force or, if the Orders are varied by another Order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, beginning with the day on which the latest variation or modification came into force. Any such objection must be made in writing and must state the grounds on which it is made and be sent to Traffic Orders, Environmental Services, Low Hall, Argall Avenue, London, E10 7AS. Any objection may be communicated to, or be seen by, other persons who may be affected.

6. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

WINNS AVENUE CPZ AND LLOYD PARK CPZ EXTENSION

(This notice is about the introduction of the Winns Avenue (WA) Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) and the Lloyd Park (LP) CPZ extension as an experiment in the first instance. During the first 6 months that this scheme is in operation, objections may be made to it being continued permanently – see paragraph 6.)

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Waltham Forest (the Council) on 14th November 2008 made The Waltham Forest (Winns Avenue) (Parking Places) (No. 1) Experimental Traffic Order 2008, The Waltham Forest (Lloyd Park) (Parking Places) Amendment (No. 1) Experimental Traffic Order 2008, The Waltham Forest (Waiting & Loading Restriction) (No. 2) Experimental Traffic Order 2008 and The Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places) (Short Stay) Amendment (No. 1) Experimental Traffic Order 2008 under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 1st December 2008 and may continue in force for up to 18 months.

2. The general effect of the Orders will be to:—

(a) introduce the Winns Avenue Controlled Parking Zone to include the following streets (E17):

Bemstead Road; Elphinstone Road, Nos. 1 and 2 only; Forest Road, the north side, from its junction with Higham Hill Road to the common boundary of Nos. 463/465 and 467/469 Forest Road; Higham Hill Road, between its junction with Forest Road and Nos. 74 and 77 Higham Hill Road; Holmes Avenue; Luton Road; Mersey Road; Renness Road, between its junction with Higham Hill Road and the boundary of the Blackhorse Lane CPZ; South Countess Road; William Morris Close; and Winns Avenue, between its junction with Higham Hill Road and the common boundary of Nos. 81/83 and 85/87 Winns Avenue;

(b) introduce the Lloyd Park CPZ extension to include the following streets (E17):

Bedford Road; Bromley Road; Chandos Avenue; Chingford Road, from its junction with Forest Road to its junction with Omnibus Way (but up to and including No. 164 Chingford Lane on the south side); Diana Road; Dudley Road; Farnan Avenue; Forest Road, the north side, from the common boundary of Nos. 463/465 and 467/469 Forest Road to its junction with Farnan Avenue; Kenilworth Avenue; and Winns Avenue, from the common boundary of Nos. 81/83 and 85/87 Winns Avenue to its junction with Winns Terrace;

(c) convert the free short stay parking places in Reness Road, located by its junction with Higham Hill Road, to shared use Winns Avenue CPZ permit and voucher parking places;

(d) provide new free, 30 minutes maximum stay, no return within 2 hours parking places in:—

(i) Mersey Road, by its junction with Winns Avenue; and

(ii) Winns Avenue, by its junction with Winns Terrace;

(e) provide that all existing 30 minutes maximum stay, no return within 2 hours parking places in:-

(i) the roads listed in paragraph 2(a) will be operational during the zone hours specified in paragraph 3(c)(i);

(ii) the roads listed in paragraph 2(b) will be operational on Mondays to Sundays inclusive between 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m.;

[NB. This is excepting the 30 minute bay in Chingford Road, the east side outside Nos. 9 to 29, which will operate on Mondays to Fridays inclusive between 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. and on Saturdays and Sundays between 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m.]

3. The Orders will provide that:-

(a) Residents' permits, business/charity permits, visitors' permits, school parking permits, residents' foreign vehicle permits and essential user permits may be issued, on payment of the appropriate charge, to a person who is the keeper of a passenger vehicle (having 8 passenger seats or less), certain goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages, providing that in the case of:—
