Stockholm, September 14, O. S.

ON the 7th Instant in the Morning, the King went down to make a Visit to Sir John Norris at the Dahlers, where his Majesty was splendidly entertained at Dinner by the Admiral on board the Sandwich Man of War, together with the Field-Marshal Ducker, the Polish Minister Lubomirski and several Swedish Generals who attended the King. In the Evening the Admiral and the whole Company supped with the King at a Seat in the Neighbourhood belonging to Baron Falkenberg, called Sandmar; and the next Day his Majesty returned to Town, having left with Admiral Sparre 1000 Ducats to be distributed among the Gunners and the rest of the Ships Crews of the Squadron under Admiral Norris's Command. On the 9th the Polish Minister Lubomirski had his Audience of Leave of the King and Queen, and on the 12th he set out from hence to return home by the Way of Germany. The same Morning the King being accompanied by Field-Marshal Ducker, went to a small Town about seven Leagues from hence called Telgia, to review some Troops of the Regiment of Horse-Guards commanded by Lieutenant General Koeskull, and returned last Night to Town. But on the 17th Instant his Majesty designs to go to Upsala, there to review the rest of the said Regiment; and it is said that some other Regiments which lye in the same Province are also ordered to be drawn together to be reviewed next Week; so that it is believed the King will be absent on this Progress 14 Days. On the 12th Instant an Officer came hither from the Swedish Squadron under Admiral Wachtmeester's Command, and brought a Let-

ter from a Muscovite Adjutant General named Romanoff, who was come from Finland with a Retinue of about 16 Persons, and has Letters from the Czar to the King and Queen, which he desires to be permitted to come hither to deliver; accordingly Orders went Yesterday to conduct him to Town, so that he is expected here some Day this Week. On the 9th in the Evening Sir John Norris came from the Dahlers up hither; and on the 11th he dispatched Major Finboe with Letters to Hanover. The same Day the Rear Admirals Hoffer and Hopson came also from the Fleet up to Town.

London, Oct. 6. The Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury came this Day to the Bank of England, and there subscribed in His Majesty's Name and on His Majesty's Behalf, the Sum of One Hundred Thousand Pounds towards circulating the publick Credit.

Whitehall, Oct. 8 On Tuesday last Warrants were prepared by Order of their Excellencies the Lords Justices, and sent to be signed by the King, for granting to the respective Corporations for Assurances, called the Royal Exchange Assurance and London Assurance, the additional Powers and Liberties to insure the Lives of any Persons, and also to insure any Houses or Goods from Fire.
