### Madrid, September 23.

AST Week the Archbishop of Toledo went to the Efcurial, to lay I before the King the Account he had received from Rome, of the Progress made in the Process begun by the Pope's Order against Cardinal Alberoni; and to defire on the Part of the Pope, that fuch Information on that Affair as can be given by the Ministers of this Court, and particularly by Father d'Aubenton his Majesty's Confessor, the Marquess de Tolofa Secretary of State, and Don Jo-feph de Patinno, may be transmitted thi-ther. The Bishop of Pampelona, the new Inquisicor-General, is on his Way hither from Pampelona. Upon Advice that the Plague continues at Marfeilles and thereabouts, repeated Orders have been fent to all the Ports, for using all Vigilance to prevent the coming in of any Veffels from the Levant without proper Certificates of Health; and the Governour of Barcelona has fent an Advice to Court, that a Catalonian Veffel which had touched at one of the Ports of Provence, had by his Order been ftopped at the Entrance of the Harbour of Barcelona, and that he had caufed the Crew of that Veffel to go with her to a Part of the Coaft lying at a proper Distance from Barcelona, there to perform strict Quarantain.

Venice Sept. 28. Field-Marshal-General Schuylenbourg having taken Leave of the chief Persons of this State and foreign Day an Arrêt was published, declaring, Ministers here, set out on the 25th Instant | that the Bank Bills shall no longer be for Germany, to fettle his private Affairs, and is expected back here the next Spring. It is advifed from Bologna, that Sig. Aldobrandini the Pope's late Nuncio to this Republick, was arrived there; and was preparing to proceed on his Journey to Genoa, in order to embark there for Barcelona on his way to the Court of Madrid, whither the Pope has ordered him to repair with all Diligence. Health of this Republick had no Letters from their Conful at Marfeilles by the two last Posts, so that at present all our Advices from the Neighbouring Parts of France are only from Aix and Nice: From which Places it is advised, that the contagious Distemper was encreased at Marseilles, that 4000 had died of it in two Days, that it was got to Aix, and feveral Villages thereabouts, as alfo in Salons, and into fome Places of the Contat d'Avignon.
