A PROCLAMATION Requiring Quarentine to be performed by Ships coming from Bourdeaux, or any of the Ports or Places on the Coast of France in the Bay of

Whereas Marseilles, and other Places in Provence in France, continue to be infested with the Plague; and whereas by our Order in Council of the twenty fifth of August last, and our Proclamation of the same Date, notifying our said Order, we required Quarentine to be performed by Ships coming from the M-diterranean; and whereas we have lately received Information, that Kid Skins and other Goods in the Said Proelamation enumerated, are usually brought from Languedoc, and Parts thereabouts, to Bourdeaux, and other Places in the Bay of Biscay, on the Coast of Frances Out of our great Regard to the Safety of His Majesty's Subjects, and for the preventing the Infection that might be brought by Ships or Vessels coming into His Majesty's Ports from any of the Said Places, by our Order in Council made this twelfth Day of October, one thousand seven hun-dred and twenty, in the seventh Year of His Majefly's Reign, we have directed and required that all Ships and Vissals, and Persons coming into the same, and arriving in any of the Ports of this Kingdom from Bourdeaux, or any of the Ports or Places on the Coast. of France in the Bay of Biscay, and that all Persons and Vissels, who or which shall receive any Goods or

for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection from Hemp, Flax, and other Goods in the Stid recited Proclamation enumerated, stall perform their Quarent tine, and that the Goods and Merchandess, imported sit such Ship or V. sil, be landed, opened, and aired, for such Times, in such Places, and under the same Regulations and Restrictions, and in such Manner as in and by our Order in Council of the said twenty fifth of August Last, and our said recited Proclamation, notifying the same, and requiring due Obedience to be part thereto, are directed and appointed for and in respect of any Vessels, Ships, or Persons, arriving in any Ports of this Kingdom from the Mediterranean: Now to the Intent that no Person whatsoever may pretend Ignorance of our Commana therein, we have thought sit, by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, and we do by this Proclamation, pursuant to an AE made in the ninth Year of the Reign of Her late Majelly Queen Anne, intituled, An Act to oblige Ships coming from Places infected, more effectually to perform their Quarentine, give Notice of he faid Orde; and do require that all Persons do yield exact Obedience to the same. And we do hereby firitly charge and command all Persons what soever, that shall come into any of the Ports of this Kingdom from Bourdeaux, or any other Ports or Places on the Guast of France in the Ray of B scay, that they do make their Quarentine according to our O'der in Council herein before recited; and that, during the time of their Quarentine, they do not presume to come or put any Goods out of such Ships on Shore, nor permit or suffer any Person to come on board such Ships; and that no Person or Persons, other than such as shall be appointed to take Gare that the Quarentine be duly perfirmed, do go on Boad, or receive any Goods from Such Ships, till they shall be discharged from their Quarentine, as in our said Pro-clamation of the twenty fif h of August last is directed, clamation of the twenty fif h of August last is directed, upon Pain of being proceeded against with the utmiss Severity that the Law will allow of, for disobeying our Commands herein, so necessary for securing the Health of His Maj sty's Subjects. And we do hereby command the Commissioners of His Majsty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Commissioners of His Maisson's suffered that they do take Gare, and give the Majesty's Customs, that they do take Gare, and give the necessary Directions, that the faid Order be put in Exec cution, and duly observed.
