## A PROCLAMATION,

W. Cant. Parker C. Holles Newcaftle, Belien, Roxburghe, J. Cruggs.

Requiring Quarentino to be performed by Ship, coming from the Mediterranean, Bourdeaux, or any of the Ports or Places on the Coast of France in the Bay of Biscay, or from the Isles of Guernsey, Fersey, Alderney, Sarke, or Man.

HEREAS Marfellles and other Places in Provence in France continue to be infected with the Plague; and whereas we have received Information that Kid-Skins, Silk, Cotton, Human Hair, and other Goods apt to retain Infection, are usually brought from Languedoc and Parts thereabouts to Bourdeaux and other Places in the Bay of Biscay on the Coast of France; and that Ships and Veffels with Persons and Goods on board coming from the Mediterranean and Places on the Coast of France in the Bay of Biscay, frequently rouch at the Isles of Jersey, and Guern-sey, Alderney, Sarke, and Man; and that a Trade is catried on by the Inhabitants of those liles with the several Places above named, and with Ships which have touched there, in Goods apt to retain Infection: And whereas we have judged it necessary for the Safety of His Majesty's Subjects, to make Iome Additions to, and Alterations in the Directions given concerning the Performance of Quatentine by our several Orders in Council of the twenty fifth of August last, and the twelsth of this Instant October, and the Proclamations notifying the same; we out of our great Care for the Preservation of His Majesty's People, and |

brought by Ships or Vessels coming into the Ports of this Kingdom from any of the faid Places, by Order in Council made this twenty seventh Day of October, one thousand seven hundred and twenty, in the Seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign, have directed and required that all Ships and Vessels, and Persons coming in the same, from the Mediterranean, or from Bourdeaux, or any of the Ports or Places on the Coast of France in the Bay of Biscay, or from the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sarke, and Man, or any of them, shall perform their Quarentine in such manner and in such Places as in and by the said Order are directed: Now to the Intent that no Person may pretend Ignorance of our Command therein, we have thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy-Council, and we do by this Proclamation, pursuant to an Act made in the ninth Year of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, Intituled, An Act to oblige Ships, coming from Places infested, more efficiually to perform their Quarentine, give Notice of the said Order, and do require, that all Persons do yield exact

Obedience to the same, vizi

I. That all Ships or Vessels arriving in any Posts of this kingdom from the Medditerranean, or from Bourdeaux, or any of the Posts of Places on the Coast of France in the Bay of Biscay, or from the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sarke, and Man, or any of them, do perform their Cuarentine for forty Days, which shall be reckoned and commence from the Day each Ship shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for the performing such Quarentine, and not before.
