THE Grand Signior has lately made publick Rejoicings for 20 Days on Account of the Circumcision of two of his Sons, and has received considerable Presents from all the Great Men of the Empire, according to the Custom on such Occasions. The Christian Ministers residing here made Presents also to his Highness, and were invited on three several Days to partake of these Rejoicings. The Chevalier Ruzzini, Ambassadour Extraordinary of the Republick of Venice, embarked some Days ago to return Home. The Turkish Ambassadour for France, is saild on Board a French Ship for Toulon: It is said he is charg'd with the usual Compliments of the Sultan to the French King on his Accession to the Crown.

Leoborne, Oct. 21. The Magistrates of Health here use all possible Diligence for preventing the bringing in of the contagious Distemper from Marseilles; and have caused a Boom of Mats to be made of 500 Yards long, from the Point of the Mole to the Tolletta, to hinder Vessels from coming into the Harbour by Night. A French Ship which is come in three Weeks from Tripoly in Barbary, has brought Advice that Giannon Cogia, who was formerly Admiral of the Grand Signior, had landed in that Country and besieged the City of Tripoly; and there seem'd to be a Disposition to a general Revolution in that Kingdom.

Sto kholm, Oct. 23, O. S. We have received an Account from the Dahlers, that Sir John Norris with the Squadron under his Command put to Sea Yesterday Morning in order to return to England.

Berlin, Nov. 9. The Lord Whitworth, the King of Great Britain's Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary for the ensuing Congress at Brunswick, arriv'd here from Hanover on the 7th Instant. The King of Prussia is not yet returned from Potsdam.

Hambourg, Nov. 15, N. S. The Lord Carteret and Mr. Wych, set out from hence Yesterday for Hanover, on their Way to England. By Letters just come in from Denmark we have an Account, that Sir John Norris with the Squadron under his Command was arriv'd in the Road of Copenhagen on the 12th Instant, and was taking in fresh Provisions with all Diligence in order to proceed to England.

Paris, Nov. 16. The greatest Part of the Actions of the India Company being now brought into the Bank, M. de Landevilian who is appointed to draw up the Lists of such Persons as are to deposite a certain Number of Actions during three Years, has notified to those who have not given in a sufficient Number, that they must furnish the Remainder without Delay, otherwise they will be proceeded against with the utmost Rigour. Letters from Marseilles of the 4th Instant confirm, that the Plague is in a Manner ceased at that Place. The Malignity of that Distemper abates considerably in those Parts of the Country to which it has reach'd; and it is certain that it has not pass'd the Rivers Rhone and Here. The Reports of its being come into any Part of West France, are wholly groundless. The Cardinal de Rohan has prevailed with the Cardinal de Noailles to publish his Mandate upon the Accommodation of the Disputes relating to the Pope's Constitution Unigenitus, and accordingly it is now in the Press.

Hague, Nov. 19. The Earl of Cadogan, His Britannick Majesty's Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, is arriv'd here from Hanover, where he had wait'd on His Majesty in his Retreat from the Court of Vienna.

Whitehall, Nov. 12. On the 9th Instant in the Afternoon the King arriv'd at Helvoetsluys. The next Morning His Majesty embark'd and put to Sea, but was oblig'd by contrary Winds to return thither the 7th. On the 9th His Majesty embark'd again, landed at Margate about Seven in the Evening on the 10th, and last Night came by Lambeth to St. James's. There were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of publick Joy in London and Westminster, for His Majesty's safe Return, who God be praised is in perfect Health.
