Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 27th April 2009

- 2. The general effect of the Orders will be to make changes to the Thornton Controlled Parking Zone, as follows:
- (a) to provide additional on-street residents' parking space (for the use of vehicles displaying the appropriate residents', visitors', trade or car club permit), either by designating new parking places, extending existing ones or in the case of Weir Road, joining and relocating two parking places:

- (vi) in Radbourne Road, the north-west side, opposite No. 63a/c Radbourne Road;
- (vii) in Radbourne Road, the south-east side, outside Nos. 69a/c and 71b/d Radbourne Road;
- (viii) in Radbourne Road, the south-east side, outside No. 77b/d Radbourne Road;
- (ix) in Radbourne Road, the north-east side, outside No. 93a/c Radbourne Road;
- (x) in Queensville Road, the north-east side, outside No. 15 Queensville Road; and
- (xi) in Weir Road, the south-east side, outside Nos. 208/210 Weir Road;
- (c) to convert on-street shared-use parking space (for the use of vehicles displaying the appropriate residents', business, teachers', primary care trust, visitors', trade or car club permit and by pay and display) into disabled persons' parking places (for the use of vehicles displaying a disabled person's "blue badge"):
- (i) in Hydethorpe Road, the south-east side, outside No. 180 Hydethorpe Road;
- (ii) in Midmoor Road, the north-west side, outside Nos. 112/114 Midmoor Road;
- (iii) in Telferscot Road, the north-east side, outside Nos. 2 and 4 Telferscot Road; and
- (iv) in Thornton Road, the north-east side, opposite No. 60 Thornton Road;
- (d) to convert on-street disabled persons' parking places to residents' parking space (for the use of vehicles displaying the appropriate residents', visitors' trade or car club permit):
- (i) in Emmanuel Road, the north-west side, outside No. 50 Emmanuel Road:
- (ii) in Radbourne Road, the north-west side, opposite Nos. 57a/c and 59b/d Radbourne Road;
- (iii) in Radbourne Road, the south-east side, outside No. 75b/d Radbourne Road;
- (iv) in Radbourne Road, the north-east side, outside No. 97b/d Radbourne Road; and
- (v) in Radbourne Road, the north-east side, outside No. 99 Radbourne Road;
- (vi) in Telferscot Road, the south-west side, outside No. 17 Telferscot Road;
- (e) to remove a certain length of shared-use parking space (for the use of vehicles displaying the appropriate residents', business, teachers', primary care trust, visitors', trade or car club permit and by pay and display) from Copthorne Avenue, the north-east side, outside No. 2 Copthorne Avenue and replace it with a single yellow line (a ban on waiting by vehicles during the hours of operation of the controlled parking zone);
- (f) to provide a motorcycle parking area in Parkthorne Road, the north-west side, adjacent to No. 33 Queensville Road;
- (g) to convert a motorcycle parking area to residents' parking space (for the use of vehicles displaying the appropriate residents', visitors',

- trade or car club permit) in Queensville Road, the north-east side, outside No. 31 Queensville Road.
- 3. The Orders are necessary to meet a change in demand for different types of parking space, in particular the demand for more disabled persons' parking space, in the Thornton CPZ generally, whilst also providing additional residents' parking space where it would not hinder the flow of traffic and where disabled persons' parking places are no longer required.

(Note: - This notice is about exempting pedal cycles from the one-way system in Stockwell Avenue and the north to south arm of Stockwell Road.)
