Portymouth , July 14. Yesterday, His Majefy accompanied by his Royal Highnels, and his Highnels Prince Rupert, arrived here from Win lfor, attended by leveral of the principal of his Court.

Milan, fily 1. From Genous they write, that that Senace was lending an Envoy to the Court at Malrid, to endevor the adjusting the difference they at present have with our Governor.

By an Express from spin, our Vice-Roy, it is faid, hath lately r. ceived directions from the Queen for the disbanding of Four Troops of Horle, at the instance of the States of these Countries, and for the fending as many more to Naples and  $Si \cdot 1/v$ , to be employed in 'the fervice of thole Kingdoms.

From Dalmatia our Letters tell us, of the Balla of Boylina's artival at Clivano, in quality of Conimitationer on the pair of the Grand Sig-nior, for the adjusting the matter of the Limits with this State, that Procurator Nani had thereupon sent to acquaint the said Bassa, that he was ready on the b half of the Republick, to conveigh himself to any place which should be agreed on, for the beginning their conferences, in order to the final concluding of this affair; the attendants of the faid Baffa being but few, and not according to the common practice of perfons of that quality; the faid Procurator is taking care, that his exceed not that number, to avoyd giving any occasion of fealousie.

From all parts we are told, of the great dispofition they find in general in the Turkish Ministers, Intion they had in general in the Turkin multiters, towards the multituning the Brick friendfhip and good underflanding with this State; the Balla of Morka hath at the inflance of Captain General Bernardo'n cauled to be reflored leveral goods and perforts, which had been taken by a Barbary Gal-leot, in one of the Ports on that ihoar; withall, declaring his readine(s, to promote on all occafideclaring his readiness, to promote on all occasions, the mutual commerce and good correspondence between his Mafters Subjects, and those of this State; We are farther informed, that the Captain Balla, as likewife the Balla of Candie, have ftriftly, com-manded all imaginable kindness to be ibown to the Subjects of this Republick, either trading by Sea, or that are Inhabitants in that Island. By some Veffels arrived here this day from Alenby tome years artified here this day tom. Atex-andria, we are tolds that the Corfairs of Barhary, which have to long infelted the Sea about Supi-enza, have quitted that Station y and are webved, again upon the approach of the Turkifi Fleer, which is now advanced, very near to thole parts.

From Smirna feveral Passengers tellus, that the Grand Visier had caused that Bassa to be hanged, for permitting false Moneys to be yended there,

by feveral Merchants, to the great lofs of the other Traders there. The Galley lately lent from Dal-matia is now ready to be dispatcht backagain, with considerable Sums of Money, and large quantities of Commodities, to be employed for the publick Service in those parts.

General Barbaro is dayly expected here from Dalmatia, and fo is General Bernardo from Zant.

Vienna, July 1. We have had here leveral allarmes of the approach of fome Turkish Forces towards our Frontiers, which after all, prove to have been without ground ; however we continue here to raife men, for the reinforcing of the feveral Regiments; and in the mean time, the Emperor hath fent directions to the Respective Officers on the Frontiers, to have an Eye upon all their actions, and to fend timely notice hither, of what ever may happen of consequence there.

In Hungary all things at prefent are very still and quiet; the 28th of the next Month is by the Emperor appointed for the determining the Commission at Preshurgh. The report of the Empresses being with child, causes a general rejoycing here, Brunswick, July 11. Here are a present quarte-

red in this Town, four Regiments of Foot, and two Troopsof Horse, who keep constant watch in all the principal places of the Town. We now find, that the dammage we received in the late Siege is very inconfiderable, and that there were not killed above Four or Five perfons.

Bruffels, Fuly 12. The French Army is at prefent seperated, and marched to their several quarters in the late conquered places; only 4000 Men have, as is faid, orders to march into Lorrain, to joyn with those that are there, under the command of the Mareshal de Crequi.

His Excellency the Court de Monterey intends, as is faid, very fuddatnly to go and visit Gelderland. The States of Brabant have not yet agreed to the raifing the Moneys defired by his Excellency, though it is hoped, a short time may bring them to a conclusion of that matter.

From Bylevelt they write, that that Treaty advances not at all, that two of the Deputies of the States General were returning home; that the Heer d'Amerongen is to continue there alone; and that the Dukes, of Lunenburgh are disbanding lome of their Forces.

Hague, July 21. The States of Holland are fill aflembled. The Velt Marshal Wursz continues in Town. Here is much discourse again of the forming a flying Army, though without any great certainty. To morrow or next day his, Highnels the Prince of Orange is expected here from Ber-Lin., from whence his Highnels parted the 8th infant.

Yesterday arrived here Collonel Bampfield from Cologna, in order, as is thought, to the giving the States General a particular account of the present posture of the affairs of that place. The Heeren vin Asperen, and Rumaert van Putten, are together with the Count deiHorne, gonehence on the part of the Countel of State, to visit several places in this Province, and to see the Fortifications be in good repair there.
