Stockholm, December 14, O. S.

N the 7th Inftant an Officer came hither from Kappelfwick, and brought an Account that a Subaltern Officer of the Czav's Life Guards was arrived there from Finland, with a Letter from that Prince for the King, which he defired Leave to come hi-ther to deliver; accordingly the Senate gave forthwith Orders for conducting him to this Place; and an Express was at the same Time fent to the King (who was gone a Hunting to A Place 15 Leagues from hence) to acquaint him therewith, which haftened his Majefty's Return. The Muscovite Officer arrived the Day before, accompanied by a Trumpeter and a Servant, and is the fame Perlon who was lately here with Adjutant General Romanioff, as his Interpreter. On the 8th, while the King was out of Town, Count Freytag notified to Count Horn by his Mafter the Emperour's Order, that his Imperial Majefty had now fully determined to fend his Plenipotentiaries to Brunfwick very fhortly ; and defired that his Swedish Majefty would also please to fend his Plenipotentiaries forthwith to that Congress ; and in cafe the Czar could not be brought to just and reasonable Terms of Peace, his Imperial Majefty would then be ready to enter into all fuch Con-certs as fhould be found proper for obli-ging the Czar by Arms to agree to fuch Conditions as fhould be judged fafe and ho nourable for Sweden.

Stockholm, Dec. 21. On the 15th Inftant, Count Horn defired a Conference with the British and other foreign Ministers refiding here, and acquainted them that feeing another Meffenger was lately come hither from Petersbourg, he was directed by his Swedish Majefty to declare to them, that the Errand he came upon was only to bring a Letter which the Czar had thought fit to fend as an Answer to one his Swedish Majefty wrote lately to that Prince by his Adjutant General Romanios;

but that the Czar's Letter contained little more, than a Repetition of his former Proposals, only now be flaces force Inclination to agree upon a general Cartel for the Exchange of Prifoners which he before declined : And that upon this laft Account the King had refolved to fend Auditor-General Dahlman back with the Mulcovite Officer to receive Proposals; and they fet out accordingly the 17th at Night for Petersburg.

Paris, Jan. 15. Forty Perlons are appointed for the Administration of the General Farms, with a Pension of 18000 Livres per Annum to each. The 1 50000 Livres which every one of them is to advance to the King, are to be paid in two Terms; one half in the Beginning of February next, and the other in March. Mefficors Paris will have the Inspection of the Accompts of the faid Gene-ral Farms. The Dukes d'Antiri and de Chaulnes have religned their Places of Honorary Directors of the India Company, and a general Affembly is to be held again To morrow at the Bank, to chule two others in their Room, and to regulate feveral Matters relating to the Accompts of the Company to the King, and those of the Directors to the Company. It is now faid that the Cardinal de Rohan's Journey to Rome is laid alide, and that the Abbot de St. Albin is defigned to go thither in his Place. The Duke of Nevers took his Place Yesterday in Parliament as Duke and Peer of France with the usual Solemnity, at which affifted the Princes of the Blood and the Pecrs.

Hague, Jan. 14. On the 8th Inflant the Marquels Beretti Landi fet out for Valenciennes. Gount Windifchgratz propofes to fet out likewife the next Week for Bruffels. The States of the Province of Holland have confented to the military Eftablifhments and Effimates for this Year; and the fame Taxes are continued as the laft: They are now wholly taken up with the Affairs of their Finances.
