Madrid, Jan. 6. The King has given Orders to the Cardinals Belluga and Borgia, to prepare to go to the Court of Rome; which Orders are thought to be occasioned by the Advices received from thence of the Pope's ill State of Health. The King and Queen set out from hence To-Morrow, to pass a few Days at the Pardo. There are no Advices come from Ceuta, since the Account brought by Express of the third Action with the Moors on the 21st past.

Paris, Jan. 22. The honorary Directors of the India Company had a Meeting on the 20th Instant at the Duke of Bourbon's, at which assisted several of the chief Proprietors of the Actions of the India Company. A Proposition is made to the General Farmers, and the General Receivers of the King's Revenues, to advance (besides the Sums they have already agreed to furnish at their entering on their Employments) six Millions more every Month, which they are

to reimburse themselves in the Course of their Administration, and the Comptroller General uses his best Endeavours to induce them to comply with this Demand. The Dutchess Dowager of Orleans is indisposed, and the Duke Regent has been several Days ill of a violent Cold. Considerable Sums of Money have been remitted to Rehnes for the Relief of the Inhabitants who suffered by the late Fire, and the Count of Toulouse sent thither some Days ago 20 Thousand Livres in Specie. A Lettre de Cachet was sent last Week to M. Colin, Rector of the Sorbonne, for the restoring of the 22 Doctors, who were turned out some time ago. This Matter will be debated in the first Assembly of that Faculty, which will be held the 1st of next Month. Don Felix Cornecho, formerly Secretary to the Spanish Embassy at this Court under the Duke of Alva, arrived here two Days ago, and is to proceed after a short Stay to Rome, in order to reside there in Quality of the Catholick King's Envoy Extraordinary. Four Ships richly laden arrived the Beginning of this Month at St. Malo, but as they came from the Levant and other suspected Places, the Governour would not suffer them to enter, but sent out four armed Vessels to be a Guard upon them, at a good Distance from the Port, till he should receive Orders from Court about them. Whereupon a Courier having been dispatched hither in order to lay before the Duke Regent the Danger which might result from the unlading of those Ships, his Royal Highness caused the Council of Commerce to assemble, wherein it was resolved to make the Men keep Quarantain, and to sink the Ships together with all their Lading.
