Paris, Jan. 25. The Dutchels Dowager of Orleans is in a fair way of Recovery, the Fever baving entirely left her; and the Duke Regent is much better with respect to the violent Cold be had upon him, but does not yet ftir abroad. The Council of Finances has met twice this Week, and we are in daily Expectation of the Refult of the Conferences. It is faid the Duke of Bourbon has proposed to creft a Company which will undertake the General Farms for fix Years, paying to the King 40 Millions per Annum, and 10 Millions by way of Advance. M. Nicolas, Banker of Paris, has likewise prefented a Project to the Coun cil, for the entire Extinction of Bank Notes after several gradual Diminutions, during which they shall be current in Payment; but we do not hear that these Proposale have been accepted. Three Ships belonging to the India Company, laden with Provisions and all forts of Merchandize, are to fail the 1ft of next Month from Port Louis for the Louisiane, The Orders given by the Court for finking four Ships with their Cargo, arrived lately at St. Malo from the Levant, have been changed upon a Reprefentation made by the Inhabitants of that Place, who would have fuffered very confiderable Damage by it; and an Exprefs has been dispatched to the Governour of St. Malo, ordering the Ships Crew to keep Quarantain on board the fame Veffels, and afterwards to put on Shore the Goods in a Place appointed, where they are to be exposed to the Air during two Months. According to the last Letters from Aix, the Plague continued to carry off a great Number of People; and they had been obliged to fend for 100 Galley-Slaves to affift in interring the dead Bodies, which lay in the Houses, and about the Streets, . A certain Tradesman there is faid to have cured many Persons of that Distemper, by Means of a Girdle and of a Drink of his prepaing, which the Government have ordered to be made publick, and defign to reward the Author.
