A PROCLAMATION, For Apprehending and Securing the Perfon of Robers Kn ghs, Calhire of the South See Company.

GEORGE R. Whereas we have received Information, That Ro-bert Knight, Calburg of the South-Sea Com-W bert Knight, Cashire of the South-Sea Com-pany, having carried on several notorious, fraudulent Praslices, to the great Detriment of the Publick, and having been under Examination before a Committee of she House of Commons, bath withdrawn himself: Ana whereas an humble Address bath been prejented to us by the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commiffioners for Shires and Burghs in Parliament affembled, That we would be graciously pleased immediately to iffue our Royal Preclamation, with such Reward as we should think proper, for Discovering, Apprehending, and De-taining the faid Robert Knight, in order that the may be brought to Justice; we have thought fit, by the Ad-vice of our Privy-Council, to iffus this our Royal Pro-clamation, hereby requiring and commanding all our loving Subjects what joever, to discover and apprehend, or sause the faid Robert Knight to be discovered and apprehended, and to carry him before fome of our Justices of the Peace, or chief Magistrates of the County, Town, or Place where he shall be apprehended; who are reor Place where we inall be apprenenated; who are re-fpectively required to fecure him, and thereof to give fpeedy Notice to our Privy-Council, or one of our Principal Secretaries of State, to the end he may be forth-coming, to be dealt withal and proceeded a-gainft according to Law; and for the Prevention of the faid Robert Knight's Eleape into Parts beyond the seas, we do require and command all our Offi-cers of the Customs, and other our Officers and Subjects of and in our respective Ports and Maritine Towns and Places within our Kingdom of Great Britain, that they, and every of them, in their respective Places and Stations. that they, and every of them, in their respective Places and Stations, be careful and diligent in the Exa-mination of all Perfons that shall pass, or endeavour to pass beyond the Seas; and if they shall discover the said Robert Knight, then to cause him to be apprehend-ed and secured, and to give Notice thereos, as aforefaid. And we do hereby strictly Charge and Command all our lowing Subjects (as they will answer the contrang as their Perils) that they do not any ways conceal, but de discover the faid Rubert Knight, to the end be may do discover the said Robert Knight, to the end he may be secured and proceeded against according to Law. And for the Encouragement of all Persons to be diligent and careful in endeayouring to discover and apprehend the faid Robert Knight, we do hereby further declare, that Jata Roberts Knight, we ab percept jurinar accure, that wholeever shall discover and apprehend the faid Robert Knight, and shall bring him before fome Justice of Peace, or chief Magistrate, as aforefaid, shall have and re-ceive as a Reward the Sum of two thousand Pounds; which faid Sum of two thousand Pounds, our Commis-foners of our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly.

Given at our Court at St. James's, the Twenty Third Day of January, 1720, in the Seventh Year of our Reign. God fave the KING. S Heriffs appointed by his Royal Highnefs the Prince of Wales.
