or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising in the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice would be revoked.

- 3. The prohibitions referred to in sub-paragraph 2(a) and (b) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Blue Badge" would apply.
- 4. The general effect of the 'Prescribed Routes' Order would be to:-
- (a) revoke the compulsory left turn from Oakington Manor Drive into Harrow Road;
- (b) introduce the one-way working in Oakington Manor Drive, between the north-eastern kerb-line of Harrow Road and a point 10.00 metres north-east of that kerb-line (south-west to north-west).
- 5. The general effect of the 'Prohibition Of Stopping Outside Schools' Order would be to prohibit any vehicle stopping or remaining at rest between 8.15 a.m. and 9.15 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in the lengths of street specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.
- 6. The prohibition to in paragraph 5 above would not apply to:-
- (a) any person causing or permitting a vehicle to stop or remain at
- (i) if that person is obliged to do so in order to prevent an accident;
- (ii) if that person is required to do by law;
- (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.
- 7. The general effect of the 'Bus Priority' Amendment Order would be to prohibit all vehicles from entering or proceeding in:-
- (i) the bus lane lying within or adjacent the length of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Notice and between the south-western kerb-line of that length of road and a longitudinal single white line marked on the carriageway of that length of road, between 7.00 a.m. and 7.00 p.m. throughout the week;
- (ii) the prohibition would not apply to:-
- (a) motor vehicles constructed or adapted to carry 8 or more passengers (excluding the driver); and local buses not so constructed or adapted; (b) dial-a-ride vehicles, pedal cycles, or licensed cabs;
- (c) a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes
- if it is reasonably necessary for that vehicle to be in the bus lane; (d) any vehicle being used in connection with the removal of any obstruction in the bus lane;
- (e) a vehicle being used for purpose in connection with the statutory powers or duties of a local authority or the supply of gas, water or electricity, or in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the bus lane, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary for the vehicle to be in the bus lane:
- (f) the pursuance of any statutory duty of the Post Office for the purpose of collecting or delivering letters provided the vehicle bears the Royal Mail livery;
- (g) any vehicle being in the bus lane to enable a person to get on or off the vehicle;
- (h) any vehicle crossing a bus lane to get to or from any road or vehicular accessway to premises adjacent the bus lane;
- (i) any vehicle being in the bus lane in order to avoid an accident or to give help in an accident or emergency or otherwise to take action for public's safety.
- 8. A copy of each of the proposed Orders, of maps of the relevant areas, of the above-mentioned Orders of 1979 and 1999 (and of the Orders which have amended those Orders), 1980 and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this Notice is published at:-

Within the "Restricted Zone":
