On the 26th past the King went a few Leagues out of Town, to take the Divertion of Hunting; his Majetty flipt two Elks, and returned on the 28th; in the Evening of which Day there was a Ball at Court. The Weather being at length become fair and frosty, the Talk of the King's making Progress into the Country is again revived; but it is said his Majesty will go no farther than Orebroe, a Town about 45 Leagues from heace on the Road to Gottenbourg, and that he will not be out above 14 Days.
