Lisbon, February 12, N. S.

ON Sunday the 2d Instant, N. S. his Portuguese Majesty went to a Hunting-Seat at Salvaterra, where he intends to continue three Weeks. The Day following the Queen and the rest of the Court set out for that Place. Commandore Stewart, in the Dover, arrived in this Harbour on the 10th Instant, and has brought with him Articles of Peace between the King of Great Britain and the Emperour of Morocco, signed by the Bashaw of Tetuan and another Person whom that Emperour had impowered to treat and conclude the same with Mr. Stewart.

Madrid, Feb. 17. Don Balthazar de Guevara, Commandore of a Squadron, is promoted to the Rank of Lieutenant-General, and is appointed to command the Galleons which are to make the next Voyage to Peru. Admiral Castagneta, who had some Time ago retired into the Country, was sent for to Court on the 12th Instant, to assist (as is believed) at a Council to be held upon Affairs relating to the Navy. Don Joseph de Pimentel, Captain of a Company in the Spanish Guards, having by a Suit at Law gained the Title of Marquess de Malpica, which was disputed with him by other Claimants, is to be married to a Daughter of the Marquess de Mancera a Grandee of Spain. The Corregidor of this City, has, by Order from his Catholick Majesty, caused all common Beggars and Vagrants found in the Streets for some Days past, to be taken up and put into the Hospitals and Workhouses.

Paris, March 8. On the 6th Instant the Duke of Chartres, the Duke of Bourbon, the Count de Charolois, the Prince of Conti, the Count de Toulouse, and the greatest Part of the Dukes and Peers were present at the Parliament, at the Ceremony of the Reception of the Duke of Richelieu in the Quality of a Peer; after which they and the greatest Part of the Parliament were splendidly entertained by him at Dinner. It is said, that those Dukes and Peers who lately petitioned the King to remove the Cognizance of the Cause relating to the Duke de la Force from the Parliament to the Privy Council, have now joined themselves to the greater Number who were of the contrary Opinion, and desire that Affair may be determined by the Parliament, as the proper Judges of all Criminal Causes relating to the Dukes and Peers; upon which 'tis believed the Council of Regency, which is to be held To-Morrow, will come to a Resolution to refer back that Affair to the Parliament. The India Company having presented a Petition to the King to be relieved from the Tenour of the Arret of the 26th of January last, by which that Company is made responsible for all the Bank Notes, M. d'Armenonville, Bignon, Desmarests, Vaubourg and Bourdonnaye, Counsellours of State, are appointed Commissaries to examine the Allegations of that Petition. The Prince of Lambesc is gone with the Marshal d'Etrées to meet the Turkish Ambassadour at Corbeil, from whence 'tis expected he will arrive here To-Night or To-Morrow Morning; his publick Entry and Audience of the King are appointed to be on Sunday the 16th Instant. They write from Provence, that some Persons have lately died of the Plague at Toulon and Terrascone, upon which they have redoubled their Precautions in those Towns against its spreading any further; it still continues at Aix and Marseilles, though very much diminished.

St. James's, Feb. 27. This Day His Majesty was pleased to admit the Right Honourable the Earl of Tankerville a Knight Brother of the most antient and most noble Order of the Thistle; being introduced by the Earls of Orkney, Southerland, Loudun, and Hadington,

St. James's, March 1. This being the Birth-Day of her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, and at Night there was a Ball.

Whitehall, March 3. Last Night the Corpse of the Right Honourable James Craggs, Esq; was privately interred in Westminster Abbey.

St. James's, March 4. His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable John Lord Carteret to be one of his Principal Secretaries of State.

Admiralty-Office, Feb. 27, 1720.
