A P R O C L A M A T I O N,

Commanding Apothecaries to follow the Dispenstatory lately compiled by the College of Physicians of London.

Hereas nothing is more likely to be of fatal Con-sequence to she Healths and Lives of our Subjetts, than the ill compounding or making up of Medi-cines, to be naminifired to Persons afflitted with Sick-ness, contrary to the Prescriptions of their Physicians, befiles that a gross Deccit thereby would be put upon the Patients: And whereas there has been compiled, in the Latin Tongue, by the College of Physicians of London, a Book, inestuled, Pharmacopæia Londinensis, preseribing and directing Apothecaries the general Forms of dispensing and compounding all sorts of Medicines, distilling Oils and Waters, and making fuch like Extrasts, together with the true Weights and Measures, by which they ought to be made; which Book, through the great Care and Industry of the said College, has been lately revised and amended, and is now perfected, and ready to be published, and is a Work which will greatly tend to the publick Good of our Suljects, by preventing all Decests, Differences, Varietics, and Incertainties in making or compounding of the Medicines, and distilling of the Oils or Waters therein mentioned, if, for the surure, the Manner and Form prescribed by the said Book should be generally and folely practified by Apothecaries and others, in their Compositions of the said Medicines, and Distillations of the said Waters or Oils, &c. We there fore being desirous to provide in all Cases for the common Good of our People, and being persuaded the establishing the general Use of the said Book may tend to the Prevention of fuch Deceits in the making and compound-ing Medicines wherein the Lives and Healths of our Subjests are so highly concerned, have, by and with the Ad-vice of our Privy-Council, thought fit to issue this our Royal Proclamation, notifying to all Apothecaries and others concerned, to the Intent they may not present Ig-norance thereof, that the said Book called Phatmacopocia Londinensis is perfected, and ready to be published: And we therefore firitly require, charge, and command all and fingular Apothecaries, and others, whose Bufiness it is to compound Medicines or distilled Oils or Waters, or make other Extracts within any Part of our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed, that they and every of them, immediately after the said Pharmacopoeia Londinensis shall be printed and published, do not compound or make any Medicine or medicineable Receipt or Pre-fcription, or diftil any Oil or Waters, or make other Exsracts, that are or shall be in the faid Pharmacopocia Londinensis mentioned or named, in any other manner or form than is or shall be directed, prescribed and set down by the faid Buok, and according to the Weights and Measures that are or shall be therein limited, except it shall be by the special Direction or Prescription of some fearned Physician in that behalf. And we do bereby publish and declare that the Offenders to the centrary shall not only incur our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for such their Contempt and Offences, according to the utmest Severities of Law.

Hague, March 18. On the 12th Instant M. Sommerdyck was appointed to command the Squadron which is to be employed this Year against the Algerines. The Captains are to be nominated by the several Admiralties that are to furnish the Ships, of which the Admiralty of Amsterdam is to fit out four, that of the Maese two, Zealand one, North-Holland one, and Friseland two Transports. M. Goes, who is appointed Envoy Extraordinary of the States to the Court of Denmark, set out from hence on the 13th; as did Yesterday M. Hop, their High Mightinesses Ambassadour to the Court of France, on his Return to Paris. Yesterday two Persons being convicted of fishing up (contrary to a Proclamation of the States) some Goods which belonged to Ships that were performing Quarentine, and were wrecked on the Coast, were for that Offence hanged.
