A PROCLAMATION, Commanding Apothecaries to follow the Dispenfatory lately compiled by the College of Physicians of London.

W Hercas nothing is more likely to be of fatal Con-sequence to she Healths and Lives of our Sub-Jests, than the ill compounding or making up of Medi-cines, to be administred to Persons afflitted with Sick-ness, contrary to the Prescriptions of their Physicians, befiles that a gross Deccit thereby would be put upon the Patients: And whereas there has been compiled, in the Latin Tongue, by the College of Physicians of London, a Book, installed, Pharmacopæia Londinensis, prescri-bing and directing Apothecaries the general Forms of dispensing and compounding all sorts of Medicines, distilling Oils and Waters, and making fuch like Extracts, together with the true Weights and Measures, by which they ought to be made; which Book, through the great Care and Industry of the said College, has been lately rewifed and amended, and is now perfected, and ready to be published, and is a Work which will greatly tend to the publick Good of our Suljects, by preventing all Decests, Differences, Varieties, and Incertainties in making or compounding of the Medicines, and distilling of the Oils or Waters therein mentioned, if, for the surve, the Manner and Form prescribed by the said Book should be generally and solely practised by Apothecaries and others, in their Compositions of the said Medicines, and Distillations of the said Waters or Oils, &c. We therefore here a discount to promide in all Sales for the common fore being desirous to provide in all Cases for the common Good of our People, and being perswaded the establishing the general Use of the said Book may tend to the Prevention of such Deceits in the making and compounding ing Medicines wherein the Lives and Healths of our Subjests are so highly concerned, have, by and with the Ad-vice of our Privy-Council, thought fit to issue this our Royal Proclamation, notifying to all Apothecaries and others concerned, to the Intent they may not pretend Ig-norance thereof, that the said Book called Phatmacopocia Londinensis is perfected, and ready to be published: And we therefore firitly require, charge, and command all and fingular Apothecaries, and others, whose Bufiness it is to compound Medicines or distilled Oils or Waters, or make other Extracts within any Part of our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed, that they and every of them, immediately after the said Pharmacopoeia Londinensis shall be printed and published, do not compound or make any Medicine or medicineable Receipt or Pre-fcription, or diftil any Oil or Waters, or make other Exsracts, that are or shall be in the faid Pharmacopocia Londinensis mentioned or named, in any other manner or form than is or shall be directed, prescribed and set down by the faid Book, and according to the Weights and Measures that are or shall be therein limited, except it shall be by the special Direction or Prescription of some fearned Physician in that behalf. And we do boreby publish and declare that the Offenders to the centrary shall not only incur our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for such their Contempt and Offences, according to the utmest Severities of Law.
