Madrid, March 4.

ON the 28th of last Month an Express arrived from Cadiz, with an Account that the two Ships from Buenos Ayres which had been long expected, came into that Port on the 23d, and with them a Man of War called the Catalan, which had been separated from the last Flota in bad Weather and had put into the Havana to refit. On the 27th past Lieutenant General Don Balthazar de Guevara set out from hence for Cadiz, in Obedience to Orders which he had received from Court, to hasten the fitting out of the Galleons for New Spain. On the 2d Instant before Day break 40 Persons were seized in this City, by Warrants from the Tribunal of the Inquisition, and put into Prison; among them were three Physicians, eminent Men in their Faculty; whether these Prisoners are charged with Judaism, or Errors against the Catholick Faith, is not yet known.

Paris, March 22. An Arrêt was published on the 17th Instant, proroguing the Term for bringing in all the Paper-Effects in order to be examined, to the 26th of May next; after which all such as shall not be produced, are to be annulled. It is believed this Arrêt will prevail upon the Proprietors of the said Paper-Effects to bring them in with more Speed than they have done hitherto. The Cardinal de Rohan who had been declared President of the Council of Conscience, being gone for Rome, the Cardinal de Gevre is named to supply his Place during his Absence. The Lieutenant de Police has received Orders to suspend the further Inquiry after such Persons as have renewed their Appeals from the Pope's Constitution to a General Council. In the mean while it is said, there are about 40 Bishops who design to adhere to the Appeal of the four Prelates who were the first Appellants. Sig. Maffey the Pope's Nuncio had a private Audience of the King on the 18th Instant; he is to be consecrated To-Morrow as Bishop of Athens, by the Cardinal de Billy. The Turkish Ambassadour had Yesterday his publick Audience of the King with great Solemnity. He went from the Hotel of Ambassadours between Nine and Ten in the Morning, attended in the same manner as when he made his publick Entry. All the Streets through which he passed, were lined with Soldiers, and the King's Household Troops were drawn up in the Tuilleries, where he alighted from his Horse, and went to the Apartment of the Duke of Bourbon, from whence, after taking some Refreshment, he was conducted to his Majesty, who was seated in the Great Gallery upon a Throne adorned with Diamonds and other precious Stones, in an Habit the Buttons and Button-Holes of which were of Diamonds, and the great Diamond which was Mr. Pitt's upon his Right Shoulder. After the Ambassadour had made his Speech, and delivered the Grand Signior's Letter, he was re-conducted in the same Order to the Hotel of Ambassadours. He is to go To-Morrow to the Palais Royal to take his Audience of the Duke Regent, and of the Archbishop of Cambray as Minister for Foreign Affairs.
