Madrid, March 4.

N the 28th of last Month an Express arrived from Cadiz, with an Account that the two Ships from Buenos Ayres which had been long expected, came into that Port on the 23d, and with them a Man of War called the Catalan, which hed been scparated from the last Flota in bad Weather and had put into the Havana to refit. On the 27th past Lieutenant General Don Balthazar de Guevara fet out from hence for Cadiz, in Obedience to Orders which he had received from Court, to haften the fitting out of the Galleons for New Spain. On the 2d Inftant before Day break 40 Perfons were fiezed in this City, by Warrants from the Tribunal of the Inquisition, and put into Prison; among them were three Physicians, eminent Men in their Faculty; whether these Prisoners are charged with Judaism, or Errours against the Catholick Faith, is not yet known. The States of the Province of Holland feparated laft Night, without coming to any Refolution (as was expected) on the Project of farming the Cuffoms, or on the other Propolitions laid before them for re-establishing and improving their Finances: The Confideration of which Matters are referred to their next Affembly.

Paris, March 22. An Arret was published on the 17th Inflant, proroguing the Term for bringing in all the Paper Effects in order to be examined, to the all the Paper-Effects in order to be evanined, to the zoth of May next; after which all fuch as fhall not be produced, are to be annulled. It is believed this Arrêt will prevail upon the Proprietors of the faid Paper Effects to bring them in with more Speed than they have done bitherto. The Cardinal de Rohan who had been declared Prefident of the Council of Cardinate declared Prefident of the Council of Conficience, being gone for Rome, the Cardinal de Gevre is named to supply his Place during his Ab-fence. The Lieutenant de Police has received Orders to fuspend the further Inquiry after fuch Perders to juipend the further inquiry after juch Per-fons as have renewed their Appeals from the Pope's Confliction to a General Council. In the mean while it is faid, there are about 40 Bifhops who de-fign to adhere to the Appeal of the four Prelates who were the first Appellants. Sig. Massey the Pope's Nuncio had a private Audience of the King on the 18th Inflant; he is to be confectated To-Morrow as Bifhop of Athens, by the Cardinal de Bifly. The Bishop of Athens, by the Cardinal de Bisfy. The Turkish Ambassadour had Yesterday his publick Au-The dience of the King with great Solemnity. He went from the Hotel of Ambaffadours between Nine and Ten in the Morning, attended in the fame manner as when he made his publick Entry. All the Streets through which he palled, were lined with Soldiers, and the King's Houfhold Troops were drawn up in the Tuil-leries, where he alighted from his Horfe, and went to the Apartment of the Duke of Bourbon, from whence, after taking fome Refrequent, he was con-whence to his Mointy, who use found in the Grast ducted to his Majeffy, who was feated in the Great Gallery upon a Throne adorned with Diamonds and other precious Stones, in an Habit the Buttons and Button-Holes of which were of Diamonds, and the great Diamond which was Mr. Pitt's upon his Right Shoulder. After the Ambaffadour had made his Speech, and delivered the Grand Signior's Letter, he was re-conducted in the fame Order to the Hotel of Ambaffadours. He is to go To-Morrow to the Pa-lais Royal to take his Audience of the Duke Regent, and of the Archbishop of Cambray as Minister for Foreign Affairs.
