Paris, March 30. The Turkish Ambassadour had on the acts Instant Audience of the Archbishop of Cambray as first Minister of State for foreign Affairs, to which he was conducted in a Coach and Six of the Archbishop's, followed by five others belonging to that Prelate, and 36 of his Footmen: He was afterwards entertained with Sweat-Meats and Sorbet in the Archbishop's Apartment. This Afternoon he will be conducted to the Italian Play-House, and next Week to the Fair of St. Germains. M.
