IS Majesty having determined to hold a Chapter of the most noble Order of the Garter, the Knights Companions resident in and near London, were summoned by Vertue of Letters from the Lord Bishop of Salisbury, Chancellour of the Order, signifying the Sovereign's Pleasure for their personal Appearance here this Evening; whereupon his Royal Highness the Prince, and ten other Knights Companions habited in their Mantles, together with the Chancellour, Garter King of Arms, and the Gentleman Uther of the Black Rod, Officers of the said Order wearing their different Budges and respective Mantles, waited his Majesty's Bidges and respective Mantics, waited this Majesty's coming, in the Apartment next to His Closet: And upon His Majesty's Appearance robed in the Mantle' of the Order, Garter by the Sovereign's Command called over the Names of the Knights Companions beginning with the Juniors, and then the Procession to the Council Chamber was in the following Order, wherein the Juniors went first and dowing Order, wherein the Juniors went first, and those Knights, whose Companions were not present, went lingle, viz.

On the Left On the Right Earl of Sunderland, and Duke of Kingstone a-breast. Duke of Newcastle alone.

Duke of Montague, and Duke of St. Alban's a-breaft.

Duke of Kent alone.

The SOVEREIGN.

Having thus entred the Chapter-Room, the Knights flood behind their several Chairs, placed according to the Situation of their Stalls in the Royal Chapel of Windsor, till the Sovereign had seated himself in a Chair of State, when the Knights Companions seated themselves by his Majesty's Leave, the Chancellour of the Order standing near His Majesty, and Gatter King of Arms having the Black Bod on the Garter King of Arms having the Black Rod on his Left Hand at the lower End of the Table. The Chancellour, by the Sovereign's Command, declared His Majesty's Intention that the Vacancy occasioned by the Death of the late Duke of Buckinghamshire, should be supplied by the Election of a new Knight Companion: The Statutes of the Order prohibiting companion: The Statutes of the Order prohibiting the Election of any Person who hath not actually received the Honour of Knighthood, the Sovereign commanded Garter to bring in Charles Duke of Grafton, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, who being introduced between Garter and the Black Rod, kneeled down before His Majesty and was ing introduced between Garter and the Black Rod, kneeled down before His Majesty and was Knighted with the Sword of State, and then retired out of the Room. Immediately afterwards each Knight Companion having wrote down the Names of nine Persons whom they esteemed qualified to be elected, that is, three Earls or of higher Degree, three Barons, and three Knights, to which they fe-verally fet their Hands; and the Chancellour having

collected their Scrutinies, beginning with the youngest Knight, and so proceeding in order, presented the same on his Knee to the Sovereign, who upon perusal thereof commanded the Chancellour to declare the faid Duke of Grafton duely elected: Upon which Garter, accompanied with the Black Rod, was fent to introduce him to the Sovereign to be invested; and having brought him to the Door of the Chapter-Room, at the Entrance he was received by the two youngest Knights and conducted between them up to the Sovereign, with the usual Reverences, up to the Sovereign, with the usual Reverences, Garter King of Arms carrying before them on a Cushion the Garter (the Ensign of the Order) and a gold George in a blue Ribbond, having the Black Rod on his Left Hand; and these junior Knights returning to their Seats, Garter King of Arms on his Knee presented to the Sovereign the Garter; who delivered the same to the two senior Knights, and they buckled it about his Left Leg, while the Chancellour read the Admonition enjoined by the Statutes; and then Garter likewise on his Knee presented to the Sovereign the blue Ribbond Knee presented to the Sovereign the blue Ribbond with the gold George, and H.s Majesty assisted by the said two senior Knights put it over his Left Shoulder, a-thwart under his Right Arm, who was then kneeling, the Chancellour at that time reading the usual Admonition; and then the faid Duke of Grafton having kiffed the Sovereign's Hand, and thanked His Majesty for the great Honour done him, rose up, saluted severally the Companions who all congratulated him, and then he workdown.

lated him, and then he withdrew.

The Chancellour then declared the Sovereign's further Pleasure of filling the Vacancy occasioned by the Death of the late Duke of Rutland, and the fame Ceremonies being in every respect observed, the Right Honourable Henry Earl of Lincoln, Gentle-man of His Majesty's Bed-Chamber, was also declared duly elected and invested with the Ensigns accordingly. And then the Knights Companions being again called over, they returned in the same Order to the Apartment next to his Majesty's Closet.

they are not acted by a Spirit of Party, though they still persist in their Appeal from his Conflicution: Which Declaration is inferted in the Registers of that The Duke of Chartres was Faculty. received on the 31st past, Great Ma-ster of the Orders of Mount Carmel and St. Lazarus. The Ceremony was performed in the Church of the Carmelites de Billettes, that Prince, and the Knights who affisted, being dressed in Habits and Cloaks of black Damask. These two Orders flatter themselves, that they shall recover several Estates which belonged to them formerly, by the Interest of their new Great Master. The same Day the Turkish Ambassadour made a Visit to Sir Robert Sutton, and continued with him near two Hours. That Ambassadour has given Leave to M. Justinial to draw his Picture, for which he has already fat several times. The Affair of the India Company depending before the Council was not decided on the 30th past, as was expected, but is put off to the next Council, which is to be held To-Morrow. A print d Paper having been dispersed containing several Reflections upon the Proceedings of the Parliament against the Duke de la Force, the Parliament has ordered the Attorney General to make an exact Enquiry after the Author of it, and to cause all Copies to be seized.
