THE BROMLEY (PRESCRIBED ROUTE) (NO. *) (WIDTH RESTRICTION) ORDER 2010.

(CHISLEHURST ROAD, ORPINGTON AND ORPINGTON ROAD, CHISLEHURST)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Bromley proposes to make the above-mentioned Orders under Sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985 and all other enabling powers.

The effect of the Orders would be to continue, during the strengthening works of the railway bridge, the temporary weight restriction of 7.5 tonnes and the width restriction of 7 feet that have been in operation since 30th March 2009, between a point 2m south of the northern boundary of No. 266 Chislehurst Road, Orpington and a point 2m north of the southern boundary of "Lucan" Orpington Road, Chislehurst.

A copy of the proposed orders, of the plans of the scheme and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays at the Bromley Civic Centre, Stockwell Close, Bromley, Kent.

THE CROYDON (FURTHER PROVISIONS) (NO. 1) TRAFFIC ORDER 2010

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council on 28 June 2010 made the above-mentioned Order under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 as amended, and all other enabling powers.

2. The general effect of the Orders would be:-

(a) to introduce 2 new 'All Zone' Permits:

(i) a 12 month permit valid in all on-street shared use pay and display/ permit parking bays at a cost of £750.00;

(ii) a 12 month permit as above but to also include parking within Croydon Council owned off-street car parks at a cost of £900.00;

(iii) All Zone permit holders would not be able to park in pay and display only bays, specifically designated parking bays such as doctor's bays, disabled bays, loading bays, ambulance bays and taxi ranks, within the Coulsdon 'Residents Only' Controlled Parking Zone or those reserved in off street car parks for specific users;

(iv) a maximum of 2 permits per householder or business would be issued;

(v) the Council reserves the right to restrict the issue of this permit where necessary;

(b) to introduce a 'companion badge' for use by residents living in the Borough who are blue badge holders and a registered keeper of a vehicle, which would then be displayed in the users vehicle, all badges are vehicle specific. They can be used on:

(i) single and double yellow lines for up to a period of 3 hours (excluding where loading restrictions apply);

(ii) in disabled bays (some bays are time limited);

(iii) in shared use pay and display/permit parking bays and pay and display only bays;

(iv) for parking in the areas described in (b) (i) to (iii) above the accompanying 'blue badge' clock must be displayed with the companion badge;

(v) vehicles displaying a 'companion badge' would not be permitted to use parking places within the Coulsdon 'Residents Only' Controlled Parking Zone;

(vi) a limit of one companion badge would be issued to a Croydon blue badge holder and a charge of £5.00 will be levied for the badge to cover an administrative cost.

3. A copy of the Order which will come into operation on 19 July 2010 and of all associated Orders can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, at the "Access Croydon Facility", Ground Floor, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, Surrey.

5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made there under have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
