Directions to our Archbiftops and Biftops, for the pre-ferring of Unity in the Church, and the Purity of the Christian Faith; particularly in the Dostrine of the Holy Trinity. GEORGE R. OST Reverend, and Right Reverend, Fa-

thers in God, we greet you well. Wherethat divers impious Tenets and Doctrines have been of late advanced and maintained with much Boldnefs and Opennefs, contrary to the great and fundamental Truths of the Christian Religion, and prticularly to the Doctrine of the Holy and Everperticularly to the Doctrine of the Fully and Ever-bleffed Trinity; and that moreover divers Per-fons, as well of the Clergy as Laity, have prefu-med to propagate fuch impious Doctrines, not on-ly by publick Difcourfe and Conversation, but alfo by writing and publifying Books and Pamphlets in Oppolition to the faid facted Truths; to the great Difhonour of Almighty God, the Diffurbance of the Peace and Quiet of this our Church and Na-tion, and the Offence of all pious and fober-minded Chriftians.

We therefore, out of our princely Care and Zeal for preferving the Purity of the Christian Faith, of which we are, under God, the chief De-Faith, of which we are, under God, the chief De-fender, and allo for preferving the Peace and Quiet of Church and State, do striftly charge and re-quire you our Archbishops and Bishops, to whom, under us, the Care of Religion more especially belongs, that you do, without Delay, signify to the Clergy of your several Dioceses this our Royal Command, which we require you to see duly pub-liss and observed; namely, that no Preacher what sever, in his Sermon or Lessure, do presume to de-liver any other Destrine, concerning the great and fun-damental Truths of our most Holy Religion, and partidamental Truths of our most Holy Religion, and parti-cularly concerning the Bleffed Trinity, than what are contained in the Holy Scriptures, and are agreeable to the three Creeds, and the thirty nine Articles of Religion.

And whereas divers good Laws have been en-And whereas divers good Laws have been en-aded for the refiraining the exorbitant Liberties a-forefaid, one particularly in the thirteenth Year of Queen Elizabeth, Intituled, An Alt for Minifers of the Church to be of found Religion; by which it is provided, "That if any Perfon Ecclefiaftical, or "which fhall have Ecclefiaftical Living, fhall ad-"vifedly maintain, or affirm, any Doctrine di-"rectly contrary or repugnant to the thirty nine "Articles and being convented before the Rihon " Articles, and being convented before the Bishop of the Diocefe, shall perfift therein, or not re-41 voke his Error, or after fuch Revocation efffoon afirm fuch untrue Doctrine, fuch maintaining, or affirming and perfifting, or fuch effloon affir-ming, fhall be juft Caufe to deprive fuch Perfon of his Ecclefiaftical Promotion; and it fhall be 65 \$6 " of his Ecclefiaftical Promotion; and it fhall be "lawful to the Bifhop of the Diocefe, or the Or-dinary, to deprive fuch Perfon fo perfifting, or "lawfully convicted of fuch eftfoons affirming, and upon fuch Sentence of Deprivation pro-"nounced, be fhall be indeed deprived:" And one other Act of Parliament made in the ninth Year of King William the Third, Intituled, An Act for the more effectual fupprefing of Blasphemy and Profammel; y by which it is provided, "That "if any Perfon fhall, by writing, printing, teach-"ing, or advifed fpeaking, deny any one of the 64 ing, or advited speaking, deny any one of the Persons in the Holy Trinity to be God; or shall 66 affert and maintain there are more Gods than one ; or fhall deny the Christian Religion to be true; or the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New ž. Testament to be of Divine Authority; and shall, upon Indictment, or information, in any 6*6* of His Majesty's Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes, be thereof lawfully convicted by the Oath of two or more credible Witneffes ; fuch Person, for the first Offence, shall be

adjudged incapable and difabled in Law to have adjudged incapable and ditabled in Law to have or enjoy any Office or Employment Ecclefia-flical, Civil, or Military; and that if any Per-fon fo convicted, as aforefaid, fhall, at the time of his Conviction, enjoy or poffers any Office, Place, or Employment, fuch Office, Place, or Employment fhall be void: And if be offend and be convicted a fecond time of any of the field trimer, the fail be diffield to fine perfor and be convicted a second time of any of the faid Crimes, he shall be disabled to fue, profe-cute, plead, or use any Action or Information in any Court of Law or Equity, or to be Guar-dian of any Child, or Executor, or Administra-tor of any Person, or capable of any Legacy, or Deed of Gift, or to bear any Office, Civil of Military, or Benefice Ecclesiafical, for ever, within this Realm. and thall also fuffer Impri-"Within this Realm; and thall alfo fuffer Imprie "forment for the Space of three Years, without "Bail or Mainprize, from the time of fuch Cone "viction:" We therefore being defirous to dif-countenance and fupprefs all fuch impious At-remnts and Pravises, to the number of our Power

tempts and Practices, to the utmost of our Power, do strictly charge and Command you to make use of your own Authority for that End, according to the Tenor and Direction of the faid A& made in the thirteenth Year of Queen Elizabeth; together with all other Means and Endeavours fuitable to your Holy Profession, for opposing and fuppref-fing all fuch Practices. And we, on our Part, will give first Charge to our Judges, and all other Civil Officers, to do their Duty in executing the faid Act made in the ninth Year of King William the Third, and all the other good and wholefome Laws made for the Prefervation of our Holy Religion, upon fuch Perfons as fhall offend against the fame, and thereby give Occasion of Scandal and Difturbance in our Church and Kingdom.

Stockholm, April 26, O. S. On the 24th Inftant in the Morning the King of Sweden and the Prince his Brother, with the Field-Marshals Ducker and Sparre, went down by Water to view the Fort of Waxholm, and fome new Works which have lately been made there for the greater Security of that important Post. Though the Wind has for feveral Days past been fair to bring Vessels from Ahland and Finland, yet there is hitherto no News come of the Swedifh Plenipotentiaries being got over thither. The Senate hath met and fat very late almost every Day fince the Arrival of M. Cam-predon; and new Infructions are prepared to predon; and new intructions are prepared to be fent to the faid Plenipotentiaries, as foon as there is certain News of their Arrival at Neu-ftadt. Laft Thurfday's Mail from Gottenbourg brought an Account, That on the 15th In-ftant, about One of the Clock in the Morning. there broke out a dreadful Fire in that Town, which burnt the whole Day, confumed between two and three hundred of the beft Houses, and most of the Houshold Goods, together with a great Quantity of all Sorts of Merchandize, fo that the whole Loss is computed at socooo Crowns. All the Swedifh Frigates that wintered at this Place, lye ready now to fall down to Waxholm; and the Carlfcroon Squadron is to fail this Week to the Ifle of Hano, to be ready to proceed up hither with Sir John Norris upon his Arrival on

that Coalt. Copenhagen, May 2. O S. On the 30th patt in the Morning, Sir John Norris with the Britilh Fleet under his Command, failed from this Road

for Hano near Carlicroon. Berlin, May 17. Yesterday the King of Prussia mustered, and exercised his three Battalions of great

great Grenadiors at Brandenbourg : His Majefty is expected here To-Morrow Night, and on the soth Inftant the Gartilon of this Fown, with two other Regiments of Foot making ten Battalions in all, will be reviewed : After which every Regiment is to be exercised apart; and then the Gens d'Armes are like wife to país in Review. It is faid the King of Prusiia will fet out for Prussia on the toth of next Month, and will be two Months on the Journey thither and back again.
