HE King of Sweden came back from Waxholm on the 27th paft. His Majefty was fomewhat indiposed when he went and has fince been very much out of order with a continued Fever; but, as it is at last turned to an intermitting one, 'tis hoped he will foon reco-ver by the usual Remedies. May it please your Majesty,

HE particular Notice your Majefty is pleased to take in your moft gracious Letter to us, of the fready Loyalty and Affection of the Church of Scotland to your Majefty's Person and Govern-ment, which they have always judged their Du-ty and Interest to maintain, does encourage and will excite us to give renewed Inflances of both on every proper Occafion that may occur. We efferem it a fingular Inflance of the Divine Good-nels that we can hold our Affembles under the Protection of your Majefty's Authority, and do with all humble Thankfulnefs acknowledge your Reyal Favour in countenancing our Meeting at this Time, and renewing to us your repeated Refolutions to promote the Interest and inviolably

to maintain the Rights and Privileges of this Church. We should be extremely wanting in our Duty to that God by whom Kings Reign, and unworthy of a King who hath thewed fo great Zeal for promoting the Reformed Religion and Virtue, and for difcouraging Vice and Immorality, if we did not on our Parts most chearfully concur with your Majefty for obtaining these valuable and defireable Ends. We are very fensible of the fatal Confequences which would inavoidably attend Dis visions among our felves, and do refolve in the Strength of our most gracious God, through Christ, to guard against all Matter of Contention, and to dilpatch the Affairs proper and necessary to be confidered in this Affembly, with that Unanimity and Concord which becomes the Members of a Body whereof our Lord Jefus Chrift, the Prince of Peace, is the Head.

The many fai hful Services of the Earl of Rothes when repr fenting your Majefty in fo many for-mer Affen blies, and his having diffinguished himmer Affen blies, and his having diffinguilled him-felf on all Occafions for the Intereft of your Ma-jefty's Government and of the Proteflant Reli-gion, and for the Safety and Welfare of the Effa-blifhed Church of Scotland, does render your Ma-jefty's Choice of him to reprefent your Royal Per-fon in this Affembly moft acceptable to us. We do with the greateft Thankfulnefs acknow-ledge the Goodnefs of God in protecting your Majefty's Perfon and conferring fo many fignal Bleffings upon your Royal Family, particularly in

Bleffings upon your Royal Family, particularly in ftrengthening the Protestant Succession by the

Birth of a young Prince. That your Majefly may be long preferved for the Comfort of this Church, the Happinels of your People, the Support of the reformed Interest, and Relief of distressed Protestants abroad, and the general Good of Europe; that the best of Blef-sings may be bestowed upon their Royal High-nesses the Prince and Princess of Wales and all their Royal lifue, and that after a long and profperous Reign upon Earth, you may be crowned with a bleffed Immortality, are the earnest and fervent Prayers of,
