N Humble Address of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the ancient Corporation of Nottingham, has been presented to His Majesty by John Plumptre and George Gregory, Elqs, their Repre-fentatives in Parliament; being introduced by his Grace the Duke of Kingston, Lord Pri-vy Seal.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to re ceive very graciously.

Paris, May 31. An Arrêt was published on the 28th Instant for the Re-establishment of the 60 Offices of Agents de Change, which were suppressed last Year by an Arrêt of the Council of the 30th of August; these Offices are to be sold for a certain Sum, according to the Determination of the Council to such Persons as the King shall approve. Mess. Dodun and Pelletier are joined in the Commission of Commissioners of the Finances with Mess. de Gaumont and d'Ornesson, under the Direction of M. de la Houssaye Comptroller Germany William Land Commission of M. neral. Within these eight Days past 15 Thieves bave been seized in this City, some of them made Resistance and killed two of the Ar-chers; it is reported there is a Gang of about 100 of them, who have been discovered by a Woman in whose House they used to meet, and Orders are given for making strict Search after them, to apprehend them. On the 28th the Turksh Ambassadour was conducted to St Cloud to see that House and Garden. The next Day he went to the King's Garden, and one Day next Week he is to go to Versailles and Marly. This Ambassa-dour's Departure from hence remains fixed to the Month of July, and the Chevalier de Nan-gis, Captain of a Man of War, is named to reconduct him to Constantinople. The 29th Sig. Massey, the Pope's Nuncio, had private Audience of the King, wherein he notified the Promotion of Cardinal Conti to the Papal Dignity by the Name of Innocent the 13th, and delivered a Letter from the Pope to his Majesty. 'Tis confirmed from Languedoc, that the Report of the Infection of the Village of Callourgue is without any Founda-tion, and that even the Fever of which feveral Persons had died there lately, was ceased. It is advised from Toulon, that fince the opening of the Houses after the last strict Quarantain, the Mortality had diminished confiderably, which is looked upon as a Proof that a great Number of People perished, rather for want of Provisions, than of the Distemper.
