Westminster, June 7.

HIS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in his Royal Robes seated on the Throne, with the usual Solemnity, Sir William Sanderfon, Gentleman-Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for improving the Manufactures, and encouraging the Consumption of raw Silk and Mohair-Yarn, by prohibiting the wearing of Buttons and Button-Holes made of Cloth, Serge, or other Stuffs.

An Act for regulating the Journey-men-Tailors within the weekly Bills of Mortality.

An Act for the better preserving and keeping in repair the Piers of the Town and Port of Whitby, in the County of York, and for explaining and making more effectual the several Acts pass'd for lengthning and repairing the Piers of Bridlington, alias Burlington, in the said County.

An Act for enlarging the Term granted by an Act pass'd in the tenth Year of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, intitl'd, An Act for repairing the Road from Highgate Gatehouse, in the County of Middlesex, to Barnet Blackhouse, in the County of Hertford, and for repairing the Road leading from the Bear-Inn in Hadley to the Sign of the Angel in Enfield Chase, in the said County of Middlesex.

An Act for confirming an Act made in the sixth Year of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, intitl'd, An Act for repairing, and enlarging the Highways between the Top of Kingsdown Hill and the City of Bath; and also several Highways leading to, and through the said City, and for cleansing, paving, and lighting the Streets, and regulating the Chairmen there, and for explaining and making the said Act more effectual.

An Act for making the Rivers Mersey and Irwell navigable from Liverpool to Manchester, in the County Palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for making navigable the River Dane from Northwich, where it joins the River Weaver, to the falling in of Wheelock Brook, in the County of Chester.

An Act for continuing the Duties granted by several Acts made in the sixth and tenth Years of Her late Majesty's Reign, for repairing the Harbour and Key of Watchet in the County of Somerset.

And to several private Bills.

Stockholm, May 17. The King is now perfectly recovered of his late Indisposition; and his Majesty has been present in the Senate every Day this Week. Count Freytag, the Emperour's Envoy, returned hither from Copenhagen some Days ago. On the 14th Instant a Battallion of the Provincial Regiment of Upland came hither; so that it is reckoned there may be now in this Neighbourhood a Body of 10000 Foot; and it is said about 5000 Horse will also be here by the End of this Month or Beginning of the next.

Hague, June 11, N.S. Letters from Berlin advise, that on the 4th of this Month M. Repsdorff, Chamberlain to the Duke of Holstein, pass'd through that Place in his Way from Riga to Hambourg: He reported that the Czar was still at Riga the 30th past, but designed to set out on his Return to Petersbourg in a few Days. The 8th Instant being the King of Great Britain's Birth-Day, M. Dayrolle, His Majesty's Resident here, entertained several Lords of the Regency and the foreign Ministers at Dinner, and with a fine Consort of Musick.

Paris, June 14. The King has recall'd the Abbot de Gamache, Auditor of the Rota, from Rome, in order to make him Archbishop of Befançon, in Recompence of his good Services; and 'tis said the Abbot Janfin, who accompanied the Cardinal de Rohan to Rome, will remain there in Quality of Auditor of the Rota. The Count de Tavannes, who presided this Year at the Assembly of the States of

Burgundy in the Duke of Bourbon's Absence, has received a Gratification from the King of 40000 Livres, and an Addition of 2000 Livres per Annum, to his Allowances as Lieutenant-General of that Province. The Memorial which the Duke de la Force presented lately to the King, will be reported to the next Council of Regency by M. Armenonville, Secretary of State. It is said the Parliament is about making a Representation to the King, to justify their Proceedings in that Affair, and to refute the Duke's Memorial, wherein he complains of several Irregularities in the Process against him. The old Duke of Bouillon is dangerously ill, and has received all the Sacraments; as has also Madame de St. Contest, Mother to M. de St. Contest, one of the King's Plenipotentiaries to the Congress of Cambray. The Turkish Ambassadour came back Yesterday Morning from Versailles. An Arret was published Yesterday, renewing the Prohibitions made formerly against bringing into this Kingdom, or wearing any Silks coming from the Indies, China, or the Levant, or any painted Callicoes coming from the said Countries.

Whitehall, June 9, 1721.

Whereas the Ship Bachelor of Newcastle, Thomas Dobson Master, having on board five Servants of the Right Honourable the Lord Polwarth His Majesty's late Ambassadour at the Court of Denmark, with Plate, Linnen, and other Goods of considerable Value belonging to his Lordship, was lost on the Gunfleet Sands on the 12th of May last: And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty that at the time the Ship was in Distress, her Crew, and other Persons (who came in Boats on Pretence of giving their Assistance) rifled and took away Part of the Goods; and that all the Lord Polwarth's Servants, with three Danes Passengers, and only one of the Crew, were lost; which Circumstances create Suspicion, that the said Servants and Passengers were murdered, in order to the better Concealment of the Goods so plundered and carried off, as aforesaid: His Majesty, on the humble Request of the Lord Polwarth, is pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon, together with the Reward of 100 l. to any one or more Persons, who shall discover the suspected Murderers, so as they be convicted.
