##### THE SCOTTISH PARLIAMENT (LETTERS PATENT AND PROCLAMATIONS) ORDER 1999

The following Letters Patent were signed by Her Majesty The Queen on the 13 December 2010 in respect of the **Alcohol Etc. (Scotland) Bill asp 18**.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories Queen Head of the Commonwealth Defender of the Faith To Our trusty and well beloved the members of the Scottish Parliament

GREETING:

FORASMUCH as a Bill has been passed by the Scottish Parliament and has been submitted to Us for Our Royal Assent by the Presiding Officer of the Scottish Parliament in accordance with the Scotland Act 1998 the short Title of which Bill is set forth in the Schedule hereto but that Bill by virtue of the Scotland Act 1998 does not become an Act of the Scottish Parliament nor have effect in the Law without Our Royal Assent signified by Letters Patent under Our Scottish Seal (that is Our Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be kept and used in Scotland in place of the Great Seal of Scotland) signed with Our own hand and recorded in the Register of the Great Seal We have therefore caused these Our Letters Patent to be made and have signed them and by them do give Our Royal Assent to that Bill **COMMANDING ALSO** the Keeper of Our Scottish Seal to seal these Our Letters with that Seal.

### Road Traffic Acts

#### *London Borough of Bexley*

##### THE BEXLEY (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO. 15) TRAFFIC ORDER 2010

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley, on 20th December 2010 made the above mentioned Traffic Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985 and all other powers, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis.

2. The general effect of the Bexley (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 15) Traffic Order 2010, would be to provide that vehicles being used by an authorised Council officer, contractor, social care or health provider may wait on lengths of any restricted street in the London Borough of Bexley whilst in pursuance of the execution of their duties, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting and provided that there is clearly displayed on that vehicle a properly authorised waiver permit issued by the Council for such purposes at a cost of £75.00.

3. Copies of the Order, The Bexley (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Consolidation Traffic Order 2009 (and the Orders that have amended that Order), any other related Orders and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, at The Contact Centre, Civic Offices, Bexleyheath, Kent DA6 7LB.

Persons desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks of the day on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
