NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONVERT PART OF A FOOTWAY INTO A NON-SEGREGATED SHARED USE CYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN FACILITY

Notice is given that the Highways Agency in exercise of its powers under the Highways Act 1980, section 65(1) and 66(4) proposes to convert a length of footway to a non-segregated shared use cycle and pedestrian facility.

The footway adjacent to the eastbound carriageway of the A36 Trunk Road from Wilton Roundabout junction with the A30 to Park Wall Junction will be converted to a shared use facility from a point 17 metres west of the centre of the Wilton Roundabout to a point 11 metres east of the centre of its junction with Netherhampton Road, the A3094, at Park Wall Junction.

TRANSPORT AND WORKS ACT 1992

The Secretary of State for Transport gives notice under section 14(1)(b), (2A), (3A) and (3AA) of the Transport and Works Act 1992 ("the Act") that he has determined under section 13(1) of the Act to make with modifications the River Mersey (Mersey Gateway Bridge) Order ("the Order").

The Order was applied for by Halton Borough Council of Municipal Building, Kingsway, Widnes, Cheshire WA8 7QF. It will authorise Halton Borough Council to construct, maintain and operate the Mersey Gateway Bridge and associated works, to acquire land compulsorily for those purposes and to charge tolls for vehicles using the new bridge. Copies of the Order, once made, may be obtained from the Stationery Office or through booksellers.

The Secretary of State has, pursuant to section 14(1)(a) of the Act, given notice of his determination by way of a decision letter dated 20 December 2010 copies of which may be obtained from the TWA Orders Unit, Department for Transport, Zone 1/31, Great Minster House, 76 Marsham Street, London SW1P 4DR. That letter gives the reasons for the determination and the considerations upon which it is based; information about the public participation process; and information regarding the right to challenge the validity of the determination and the procedures for doing so.

The Secretary of State confirms that, before making his determination, he considered the environmental statement provided by the applicant and all objections and other representations relating to it, and that he otherwise complied with the obligations referred to in section 14(3A) of the Act. For the purposes of section 14(3AA), he confirms that the main measures to avoid, reduce and, if possible, remedy any major adverse environmental effects are those referred to in paragraphs 45 and 46 of, and the conditions in Annex 1 to, the decision letter.

PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990, SECTION 69

ELSTOW CONSERVATION AREA

Notice is given under the provisions of the 1990 Act that Bedford Borough Council has determined that the area described in the Schedule to this Notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest, and that it is desirable to preserve or enhance its character or appearance. It has accordingly extended the Elstow Conservation Area, so as to include this area.

The principal effects of this area being included within a Conservation Area are as follows:

1. The Council is under a duty to prepare proposals to ensure the preservation or enhancement of the area.
2. Conservation Area Consent will now be required for the demolition of all unlisted buildings (other than excepted buildings) in the area.
3. Special publicity must be given to planning applications for development in the area.
4. In carrying out any functions under the planning Acts (and, in particular, in determining applications for planning permission and listed building consent), the Council and the Secretary of State are required to take into account the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area.
5. Six weeks' notice must be given to the Council before works are carried out to any tree in the area.
