Copenhagen, June 30, N. S.

ON the 18th Instant the King of Denmark with the whole Court went to Fredericksberg, and the next Day his Majesty with the Prince Royal came within a Mile of this Town, and took a Review of the Regiments of Foot-Guards, as also of Prince Christian's, Prince Charles's, Zepetin's, and one Battallion of the Prince of Sunderburg's. His Majesty went after the Review to Walloe, a Country Seat belonging to the Queen, and returned to Fredericksberg the 28th, where he created that Day the following Gentlemen Knights of the Order of Dannebrog, viz. M. Virek, M. Gersdorf, and M. Holst. This Day his Majesty reviewed his Horse-Guards, and a Regiment of Dragoons called the Jutland Regiment. The Prince Royal sets out in a few Days to Travel, attended by Count Holst, who was lately made Great Chancellor of this Kingdom. The King's Journey to Holstein, is put off for some time.

Dantzick, June 14, O. S. Yesterday arrived here from Riga the Danish Envoy M. Westphale, who upon the Czar's Departure from thence for Revel had his Audience of Leave, and is now returning to Copenhagen. He reports, that the Czar during his Stay at Riga had a very dangerous Fit of Sickness, and is still in a weak State of Health; and that his Czarish Majesty's largest Men of War keep within the Harbour of Cronslot. A few Days ago the King of Prussia reviewed near Coningsberg 11 Regiments, which are since gone back to their respective Quarters; and his Majesty is gone on in his Progress through those Parts of his Dominions. Yesterday passed through this Place Prince George of Hesse Cassel, who came from Sweden, and is going to the King of Prussia.

Madrid, June 23. The King, Queen, and Royal Family, having come hither some Days ago from Aranjuez, to assist at the usual Processions and Devotions on the Festival called Corpus Christi, went on the 16th Instant to the Escorial for the rest of the Summer Season. We have an Account from Rome, that the two Spanish Cardinals arrived at Civita Vecchia on the 25th of May, and proceeded from thence to Rome, where they wait for Orders from this Court. An Express from Cadiz has brought the News, that an Advice-Ship from Peru is arrived there; By this Ship are also come Letters from Mexico dated in March last,

which she took in at the Havana. The King in Consideration of the great Services of the Marquess de Grimaldo, Secretary of the Dispatches, has promoted him to the Dignity of Counsellour of State.

Paris, July 5. On the 30th past a Lettre de Cachet was sent to M. Jollain, Syndick of the Sorbonne, to remove him not only from that Employment; but also from his Degree of Doctor of that Faculty, and to order him not to appear any more at their Assembly. The next Day the Sorbonne had its usual monthly Meeting, wherein an Order from the King was produced, appointing M. de Romigny, Nephew to M. Chartron, Dean of that Faculty, Syndick in the Room of the said M. Jollain: Whereupon great Debates arising, 108 Doctors voted to send Deputies to the King, to make proper Representations, and to intreat his Majesty to maintain them in their Privileges, and 52 were for an absolute Compliance with the King's Orders: Which Orders concerning the Syndick being very positive, he was suffered to enter upon his Employment. On the 2d Instant the Parliament assembled upon the Duke de la Force's Affair, most of the Princes of the Blood, Dukes and Peers, being present, but no Resolution was taken in it by Reason of two Memorials which were presented that Morning to the Parliament by the Company of the Sellers of Earthen Ware, and the Distillers of this City, concerning 22 Chests of China Ware, and several Pipes of Alicant Wine which had been seized some time ago, and which they petition may be confiscated to their Profit. These two Memorials were ordered to be communicated to the adverse Party, and another Meeting is appointed on the 7th Instant. Nothing was resolved upon in the last Council of Regency with Relation to the India Company. Two hundred and ten Clerks are appointed at the Bank, for putting into Order all the Paper-Effects which have been examined in the several Offices established for that Purpose.
