Stockholm, July 26.

AST Week the King of Sweden took the Diversion of Hunting in the neigh bouring Country; his Majesty staid but one Night Abroad, and returned to Carlberg in the Evening. An Express which went on the 10th Instant from hence for Neustadt, returned hither on the 21st at Night, and was dispatched back on the 24th. On the 23d, M. Berkentyn the Danish Minister, had private Audiences of the King and Queen at Carlberg, when he notified the King his Master's Mar riage with the Dutchess of Sleswick. Day the King reviewed the Regiment of Foot Guards in the Park near this City; and it is faid his Majesty will some Day this Week review likewise ail the other Regiments that are now here. Sir John Norris has been here some Days, and Rear-Admiral Hobson came up hither Yesterday from Cappel Share, where the Fleets continue.

Turin, July 26. The King and Madam Royale are both entirely recovered of their late Indisposition. Yesterday publick Notice was given, that at the End of this Month the Barriers between this Place and Milan will be opened; and that Goods or Passengers will

be exempted from Quarantain.

Dresden, Aug. 13. The Prince Royal of Denmark with the Princess his Consort, set out on the 15th Instant from Preitsch, in order to meet the King and Queen of Denmark in Holstein; It was expected the Prince would have made a Turn hither, but his Royal Highness has sent M. Gersdorf, first Gentleman of his Bed Chamber, to make his Compliments to the King of Poland. Two Days ago a Courier arrived from Warsaw, with Advice of the Death of the Archbishop of Gnesha, Primate of the Kingdom of Poland. His Polish M jesty will be going in a few Days to Toplitz, to use the Waters there. Sig. Archinto, whom the Pope has appointed as Nuncio to Relieve Sig. Grimaldi in Poland, arrived here on the 11th Instant, and will proceed To-Day on his Journey to Warsaw.

Berne, Aug. 13. The General Dyet of the Swis Cantons affembled at Frawenteld, put an End to their Session on the 6th Instant. Refult of their Deliberations on the Proposition of the Circle of Swabia to prohibit all Commerce with France, on account of the Plague, was, to write a Letter to the Duke of Wirtenberg, Director of that Circle, defiring a Conference may be held between Deputies to benamed on both Sides, for concerting the Precautions fit to be taken at this Juneture for their mutual Security. It was likewise resolved in this Dyet, that four Deputies from the Cantons of Zurich, Berne, Lucerne and Ury, should go to Wilchingen, on the Part of the whole Body, to exhort the Inhabitants of that Community to pay that Submission and Homage which for some Time they have refused to render to their Soveraign the Canton of Schaffhuysen, upon a Pretence that Wilchingen is an Arriere Fief of the Empire.

Paris, Aug. 20. On the 16th Instant the King accompanied by the Duke Regent, the Dukes of Chartres and Bourbon, the Count of Clermont, the Prince of Conti, and the Marshal de Villeroy, went to the Metropolitan Church of Nôtre Dame to return God Thanks for his Recovery. There being a Diffor his Recovery. There being a Dispute between the Clergy of that Church, and the King's Chaplains about the officiating on fuch Occasions (the Decision whereof the Duke Regent has thought fit to refer to the King's Majority) his Majesty did not enter into the Choir if the Church, but heard only a low Mass without, in the Chapel of the Holy Virgin, which was said by the Abbot de Maur, one of his Majesty's Chaplains. His Majesty continues in perfect good Health, and is taken up with receiving the Compliments upon his Recovery from the Superior Courts of Justice, and the leveral principal Societies of this City. On the 17th the Cardinal de Noailles at the Head of the Chapter of Nôtre Dame went to congratulate his Majesty upon that Occation, and to thank him for having honoured their Church the Day before with his Presence; and the Day following his Majesty was complimented by the Deputies of the Parliament, M. de Meimes first President being
