Constantinople, June 28.

A Dulcignote Vessel, with about fifteen Sailors on Board, being lately in the Port of Venice, and lying by the Shore, the Sailors had a Quarrel with some Venetians, and from their Vessel fired upon the latter, and killed two or three of them; whereupon the Venetian Mob got together, and either burnt or sunk the Vessel and all her Men. The Venetian Bailo here has received an Express with Advice of this Accident, before the Port has had any Account of it from Dulcigno, and has represented it in so plausible a Manner, that the Vizier has sent Orders to the Dulcignotes to forbear committing any Hostilities upon the Venetians, which it is likely they would otherwise have done, and has directed the Pasha to inquire into the Fact, and send him an exact Relation of it.

Paris, Aug. 27. On the 25th Instant being St. Lewis's Day, the Carmelites of St. Maubert went in Procession to the Chapel of the Tuilleries, to say Mass according to Custom; and passing through the Rue de la Feronerie, where King Henry the Fourth was assassinated, they stopt to sing the usual Hymn for the Repose of that Prince's Soul. That Evening there was a Consort of Musick in the Gardens of the Tuilleries, followed by a Fire-work, both which were performed with great Skill and to the Satisfaction of the Company, which was very numerous. The King was upon the Terras under a magnificent Canopy, surrounded by the Princes of the Blood and his chief Officers. The Farm of Tobacco is not given to the India Company, as was expected, but to another Company consisting of 12 Persons, at the Head of whom are Messrs. Bonnevier and l'Allemand de Bez, two of the General Farmers. The Lease is for nine Years, and will begin from the 1st of October next, but it is not yet published in due Form. The King has granted to M. de Morville the Reversion of the Employment of Secretary of State which M. d'Armenonville his Father has at present, together with a Brevet de Retinue of 400000 Livres; some say the latter will

have the Province of Secretary of State for foreign Affairs in the Room of the Cardinal du Bois, and that then his Son will succeed him immediately. The Abböt Passarini is expected here from Rome, with the Cap for the said Cardinal du Bois, who has caused Lodgings to be prepared for that Abböt in the Hôtel d'Effiat, which that Prelate has hired for his Retinue. According to our Advices from la Canourgue of the 12th Instant, the two Physicians the Court sent thither some time ago, were entirely recovered from the Plague, of which they had been ill, and the Number of the Dead and Sick diminished daily. There are Letters in Town from Montpellier and other Places in Languedoc, which say, that the Distemper had got among some of the Troops which are in the Gevaudan to guard the Lines; and that two of the infected Companies were shut up by other Troops, to hinder the further spreading of that Sicknes.

Genoa, Aug. 5, N. S. This Day the Magistrates of Health signified in Writing to Mr. Henshaw the British Consul here, that this Republick considering the present dangerous State of Health, has resolved not to admit henceforward into this Port of Genoa, any Ships coming from the Ocean into the Mediterranean, be they British, Dutch, or of any other Nation, unless they produce Certificates from the proper Magistrates of the Place or Port where they were laden, that the said Place or Port was free from the Plague, and that the Goods laden in them were actually put on board them at such Place or Port.

The preceding Article is published, to the Intent all British Merchants trading to Genoa, may take Notice of the Rules prescribed therein, and conform themselves thereto, to prevent any Inconveniences or Losses which they may otherwise sustain.
