Stockholm, August 9.

ON the 3d Instant Sir John Norris and Rear-Admiral Hopson came hither from the Fleets at Capel-Share, and are both still in Town. The 3d being the Birth-Day of the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel, the King and Queen received the Compliments of the Chief Persons of Quality on that Occasion at Carlberg, in the Evening their Majesties came hither, and at Night there was a Ball. On the 4th the King found himself indisposed, and continuing so the two following Days, his Majesty resolved to go and drink the Mineral Waters at Wyksberg, about six Leagues from hence; whither he accordingly went on the 7th. The Queen came the same Day from Carlberg to the Palace here.

Cadix, Aug. 12. The Flota is expected Home from the West-Indies before the End of this Month. Thirteen Pieces of Cannon and two Mortars were lately sent from hence to Ceuta. The three Spanish Men of War of 50 to 60 Guns each, which carried the Spanish Cardinals to Italy, are now at Alicant: It is said they are to join the Dutch Vice-Admiral, who is now in this Bay with four Ships of his Squadron of 50 Guns each, and cruize against the Algerines. Wheat and Barley being very cheap in these Parts, great Quantities have been sent lately to the Canaries, where for some Time past the Inhabitants have been in great Want of Corn. On the 9th Instant died Mr. Charles Russel, His Britannick Majesty's Consul at St. Lucar.

Berne, Aug. 20. The Deputies of this Canton who went to the Dyet at Frawenfeldt, are now assembled at Baden with those of Zurich and Glaris, to regulate certain Affairs relating to the Town and County of Baden, which formerly belonged to the Eight eldest Cantons, but in the last Swiss War was given up to Zurich and Berne in Pro-

priety, with a Reservation to the Canton of Glaris (which is mostly Protestant) of the Share it had before in the Sovereignty of that District. The three Deputies of Zurich, Lucern and Ury, who were commissioned by the late General Dyet to go to Wilchingen, to try to compose the Differences which have been long standing between the Inhabitants of that Place and the Canton of Schafhuysen whose Subjects they are, have offered those Inhabitants a full Pardon for all past Misbehaviour, and the Maintenance of their Privileges for the future, provided they forthwith return to their Duty; but it is advised that those of Wilchingen persist hitherto in their Disobedience.

Hambourg, Aug. 26. On the 22d Instant in the Evening, the Prince Royal of Denmark, with the Princess his Consort, passed through this City, our Artillery firing during their Passage. Their Royal Highnesses took up their Lodging at a Country Seat in this Neighbourhood, between Altena and Ottensee; whither the Magistrates of this Place, and other Persons of Distinction, went to make them their Compliments. This Morning their Royal Highnesses set out from thence for Sleswick, where they will be met by the King and Queen of Denmark with a numerous Court.

Paris, Aug. 30. On the 28th the King assisted for the first Time since his late Indisposition at the Council of Regency. His Majesty has granted the Privilege of entering at all Hours into his Bed-Chamber, to the Duke of Bouffleurs, the Duke de Monmorency, and to his Brother the Count de Ligny. We have an Account from Port Louis of the 22d Instant, that M. de Blangy, Commander of some Ships the India Company sent a Year and a half ago to the East-Indies, was arrived in that Port with the Ship called Le Solide. Two other Ships under his Command, and which belong to the same Com-

Company, set Sail at the same Time from Pondichery, but were separated from him about 600 Leagues off the Coast of Brittany. Those Ships are said to be richly laden with several Sorts of Goods from Bengal and the Coast of Coromandel. The Duke de la Force has obtain'd the King's Letters Patents, by which all the Causes concerning that Duke are to be brought before the Great Council, during the Space of three Years. An Arrêt was published on the 28th Instant, fixing the Roads from Languedoc to Paris, and from hence to that Province; by which Care is taken to make Passengers keep at a great Distance from all the infected Places.

Paris, Sept. 3. The Sale of the Merchandizes that were seized some time ago in the Convent of the Augustins, at the Request of the Grocers of this City, began on the 29th past. An Express arriv'd here the 1st Instant from Port Louis, with Advice of the Arrival of the two Ships belonging to the India Company, that were separated from that called Le Solide. The Chevalier de Mazières, a Gentleman of Anjou, being convicted of having counterfeited the Coin, was beheaded on the 30th past at the Greve. The same Night Mess. de Marbeuf and de Basoy, two Gentlemen of good Families in the grey Musketeers, happened to quarrel with the Patrol, and having drawn their Swords were killed by them. M. de Camillac, Commander of the said Musketeers, prosecutes the Persons who killed them, upon an Information that they began the Quarrel. An Ordinance of the King's was published two Days ago, importing, that in order to prevent the more effectually the further spreading of the Plague, all Officers of the Troops, that are already, or may hereafter be ordered to march into Dauphiné, Provence, Languedoc, Auvergne, and the Generalities of Bourdeaux and Montauban, are to repair forthwith to their Posts on Pain of being broke.

Whereas on the 27th of April last, James Herbert, of Kingsly, Esq; late Knight of the Shire for the County of Oxford, was by a Pond at Waldridge, in the Parish of Dymton, in the County of Bucks, found dead; and, from many Circumstances lately discovered, was supposed to be strangled, and his Body brought and laid where the same was found; and whereas humble Application hath been made to His Majesty, by his Widow, to offer a Pardon to any one Person who shall first discover the Person or Persons guilty of the Murder of the said James Herbert, so as they, or any of them, may be brought to condign Punishment: His Majesty being desirous to have a Discovery of so horrid a Fact, doth promise a Pardon to the first Person who shall make Discovery of such Person or Persons who have been concerned in the said Murder, so as he or they may be convicted and brought to Punishment for the same.
