*Whitehall, Sept. 11.* Captain Stewart by a Letter from Tetuan, dated the 17th of August, O. S. gives an Account that he was come thither from Mequinez with all the British Captives and with some other Christian Slaves, and designed to take the first Opportunity to carry them over to Gibraltar. Whereupon His Majesty has been pleased to order the Remainder of the Presents in Cloth, Gun-Locks, &c. agreed to be given to the Emperour of Morocco for the Enlargement of the British Captives, amounting in the whole to near twenty thousand Pounds, to be dispatched to Tetuan with all Expedition.

Mr. Foulis, His Majesty's late Consul at Ostend, is appointed Consul at Seville and St. Lucar.
